Brothers.

First, let me thank each of you for the prayers, thoughts, visits and other kindnesses during my recent hospital stay. The gall bladder is out and I am feeling fine again.

Looking at the calendar it appears vacation time is over and we are back to our busy schedule. We have the Tootsie Roll Drive on two weekends, a family picnic, Apache Gold Trip and a Corporate Communion breakfast this month as well as the resumption of our donut sales program.

I especially want to ask that you get involved with the Tootsie Roll Drive. As you may know, this is a statewide drive to benefit those with intellectual disabilities. Three fourths of all the funds we raise as a council is paid to a charity that we designate which serves people with intellectual disabilities. In the past we have designated the St. Pius Circle of Friends and the Santa Rita Special Education class to receive these funds. The remaining one fourth is distributed to similar programs in Arizona areas that are not served by a Knights of Columbus council. Our only expenses are Tootsie Rolls, aprons and

collection cans. All the rest of the money collected goes to the charities.

This year, due to schedule complications, we are holding the drive over two weekends – Oct 15-16 at Wal-Mart and Oct 21-23 at Fry's (Safeway is unable to accommodate us this year).

Please be generous with your time. We ask that you volunteer to work a two-hour shift at least once. If you are unable to work, please make a monetary contribution of \$25 or more (tax deductible). You can send checks to the address at the top of this newsletter. Mark "Tootsie Roll Drive" in the memo portion. You can also just bring a donation to a council meeting this month.

With the recent hurricane disasters and our more limited collection opportunities, fund raising will be more challenging this year. It is more important than ever that we do our best to support this wonderful program.
