Dear Brother Knights,

About our purpose, let us remember the degrees to which we have been called and the responsibilities to which we have been committed. We are an order of men called to charity, unity and fraternity. While each of these refer to a specific degree and each has a corresponding expectation of commitment, they are also qualities the Our Lord has asked each of his disciples to practice as they live out their faith. They are markers that identify a true Christian. As Knights, we are challenged to make these three pillars of faith come alive in our daily living. We are to be witnesses to the reality that Christians are called to make these pillars the center of our daily living.

Charity is the call to love. Jesus commanded his disciples at the Last Supper to "love another as I have loved you." Several times he reminds them (and us) that he has given a new commandment. We, like them, are called to love with all that we are including loving neighbor as self. Jesus is calling to love as he loved the Father.

Unity flows from charity. Again in his Last Supper Discourse (John 14 - 17) Jesus invites his friends to the same unity that he has with the Father. To strive for unity through love is to experience the fullness of joy. Ultimately, God wants us to be joy filled.

Fraternity becomes the connection between unity and charity. Love establishes a bond between ourselves and God. It also creates a link between each human person. We no longer live in isolation. We live for God and we live for others. Charity can never exist in a vacuum. Nor can unity stand alone. Just as God is a supreme being living in the fullest expression of relationships, we imitate that reality in our daily lives as we strive to love one another.

My Brothers, let us this coming year put these three pillars of our Order into practice so that we can experience the fullness of the promise.
