# A Message From Our Pro-Life Director - Tim Johnson

Friends.

It has been a long time since I sent out a pro-life message, so greetings my friends.

I am the Culture of Life director for Knights of Columbus 759 and my wife, Teresa, is my partner in this endeavor. Last week was our routine 4th Sunday prayer vigil at an abortion clinic here is Fort Worth. Our usual visit in previous months was to Whole Women's Health (WWH) abortion facility in Fort Worth, however, an anti-Catholic group tied to "Abortion Abolitionists" had moved in to mount an outwardly vocal protest against abortion, the workers and the clients themselves. Additionally, investigators found out that members of this group were arrested and tried for conspiracy in attempting to blow a Christian community church in Burleson, as the pastor was not prolife enough. Needless to say, the attorney for Catholics United for Life and the Fort Worth Diocese Respect Life office strongly advised us not to visit the WWH while the Abortion Abolitionists were on site. This weighed heavy on our hearts as since numerous abortion clinics closed in Texas as a result of HB2, WWH began performing abortions on Friday, Saturday and Sunday. Each of those days, the parking lot was crammed pack. We wanted to be a witness at the site, but we could not be seen as collaborating with the group, nor could we put the youth, that accompany us, in jeopardy.

Incidentally, the Abortion Abolitionists are the same group that yelled anti-Catholic slurs verbal attacks on marchers at the 2012 Dallas March for Life. It took all my might not to react to their ignorant, stupid and vulgar attacks. It is just plain idiotic that at an event that brings all walks of faith, race, ethnicity together to show solidarity in ending abortion, that one group seeks to divide the cause because of their self-righteous and arrogant view points.

So, in May, Teresa and I received the word that the group had moved on to yelling at high school students outside their campuses. This was great news because we had been away from WWH way too long. So, on May 24th, we went to hold our prayer vigil at WWH, even though, it was closed for the weekend, thanks be to God. In our company were a couple of Knights of Columbus, one whole family, a mother and a youth minister with his

daughter. I would like to say our prayer vigil was peaceful, but that is not the way it was in the spiritual sense of things. The WWH moniker was a stirring reminder of what this place and its staff does, remembering that hundreds of babies have been killed here in the past year, with there mothers wounded and families either in denial a life was lost, or suffering because a family member was not given the chance to be part of their lives. Additionally. Satan's minnions tried to distract us during our prayers, as a murder of crows cawed unceasingly and the traffic was unusally heavy. However, we persevered in our prayers, knowing the Holy Spirit was burning in our hearts, we had each other, and our guardian angels and a cloud of witnesses were there to encourage us and protect us from all harm, physical or spiritual. Near the end, a man came up and talked to our knights. He was attending an AA meeting up the street and saw us. He came to pray with us and to offer his thanks for us being there, then asked for our prayers for him in his journey to sobriety. As we were leaving, another family from another community came to pray, so we greeted them and then left.

We then had breakfast at the The Swiss Pastry Shop on Vickery, just off of Montgomery, what a nice place and the staff gathered tables together so we could eat together. It was an affordable, good breakfast with plenty of great conversation.

It is good to see families involved in prayer vigils at abortion clinics as it helps to bring the awareness of personal accountability to the forefront in their family. It also shows that there already has been discussions in the families about respecting life. Seeing youth by themselves on these prayer vigils is a good thing, but it is even greater when their parents come along.

Not to long ago I heard someone who is going to host a student pro-life event at their parish this summer, say, "we are having pro-life talks and activities and we are not just going to talk about abortion." The person did not elaborate, but looking at the audience of soon-to-be high schoolers, I thought this could be good, because I envisioned activities that fearlessly and confidently promoted chastity, self-control, modesty, self-respect and the beauty of being created in the image of God as either man or woman. Far too often, I hear chastity spoken as a four-letter word, or as if the speaker has already despaired in thinking the worse of folks in the audience - that no one can live a chaste life - or that speaking about chastity is a lost cause. All of us must be fearless and confident in speaking about chastity, self-control and personal responsibility as it becomes a matter of life or death for an unborn child who is a product of an "unintented pregnancy".

Thanks for the ear. Our next prayer vigil will be on June 28th.
