Dear Jim,

Thanks for contacting me; it is great to hear from you on behalf of the Knights in Keller. Things are going really well here in Europe. I just completed my first year of theology studies, making it 3 years down, 4 years to go until priesthood. I finished my final exams on June 22, which is pretty late compared with final exams in the States. After exams I took the next week to travel around the city of Rome and see some of the places I had been meaning to visit. Especially, I had been wanting to visit Tre Fontane, where St. Paul was beheaded. Providentially, the feast of Sts. Peter and Paul happened to fall during my week off, so I decided to make a Pauline pilgrimage from the basilica of St. Paul's outside-the-walls to Tre Fontane, then back

to the basilica for the vigil Mass. This feast is especially meaningful for me, since Paul is my Confirmation saint. I had just returned to the Basilica to pray before Mass when, to my surprise, the MC asked me to be the second lector at the Mass. I was both surprised and honored to have the opportunity to read St. Paul's letter to the Galatians on his feast day in his basilica, just a few yards from his tomb. It was truly an amazing honor to be asked to serve in this way.

The next day, the North American College hosted a reception for our three newest Archbishops: Chaput of Philadelphia, Lori of Baltimore, and Aquila of Denver. Of course, you know Archbishop Lori as the chaplain of the Knights of Columbus. It was a blessing to host them, and it gives me hope to see the strength of our Church leaders. We can all be proud of them and we should certainly pray hard for them.

At the present moment I am in Avila, Spain taking summer courses in Spanish and on Spanish mysticism, where we are reading St. Teresa of Jesus and St. John of the Cross. I am really enjoying this chance to be immersed in the Spanish language and in the spiritual theology of the Saints, in the very places where they walked. I am learning so much that I can't wait to share with everyone back in Fort Worth. In addition to my classes, we have taken several excursions to various towns which have some religious and cultural significance. So far I have been to Salamanca, Fontiveros, Alba de Tormes, Segovia, and the enormous monastery El Escorial. All of these places have some tie to the lives of Sts. Teresa and John. This coming Friday we will go to Toledo, and I am planning to spend one or two days in Madrid. Spain is a wonderful place, with a great Catholic heritage, and it is encouraging to find the old churches filled with the faithful here in Avila.

On July 28th I will go up to France for three weeks of parish ministry before returning to Rome. I am excited, but a little nervous because I haven't used my French much in the last 12 years. I am going to try and stay focused on sharing the hope and love of Christ with others and leave the rest up to the Holy Spirit. I'll be in a parish in Carnac, which is in the Brittany region, i.e. the NW coast of France. After that, I'll return to Rome to serve on the orientation team for the new men. I'll be in charge of cantoring at Mass as well as photography throughout orientation.

I plan to send y'all a more formal letter when I return to Rome, but I am glad we can communicate through email in the meantime. For now, I will leave you with some pictures from Spain. May God bless you and perfect you in charity. I will pray for you especially on this day, the feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel.

#### 2012 Footsteps of the Saints Pilgrimage

During March 2012, Bishop Vann appointed John Ryan (KC 759) Diocesan Pilgrimage Director for the 2012 Footsteps of the Saints Pilgrimage (sponsored by St Francis Church and KC 7099 Chaplain Fr Anh) that departs August 3 and returns on August 8th, 2012. As Director, John will lead 30 Boy Scouts and 15 Scout Adults on a pilgrimage to New Mexico exploring the lives of the saints as a National Catholic Committee on Scouting program. John will be accompanied by KC 759 member, Dale Shipman, who will be managing the "3 Amigos" food operation for the entire group. Presently, there are 5 adults and 6 Scouts from Troop 32 including Michael Shipman and Nolan Ryan (sons of KC 759 members). A few of these Scouts/Scouters appeared in a story carried by the Texas Knight on their website several months ago. Scouts and Scouters from Arlington to Muenster, Wichita Falls to Keller and from 6 different Troops around the diocese will participate in this groundbreaking sojourn.

Our Footsteps Pilgrimage will include study regarding Venerated Fr McGivney as one of the subjects of our Scouts curriculum. St Juan Diego, Blessed Pope John Paul II, Blessed Fr Serra, and Blessed Katera Tekakwitha will round out the topics of our program.

The 2012 Footsteps Pilgrimage is sponsored by St Francis Church and will also be attended by Fr Anh Tran as well as Diocese of

Ft Worth Seminarian Thomas Jones. Fr Anh is Pastor of St Francis Church, KC 7099 Chaplain and Region Chaplain for the National Catholic Committee. KC 759 members Dale Shipman, John Ryan and their sons have participated in fund raising activities that have raised almost \$6,000 for Scout Scholarships and the expense of a commercial bus. These scholarships have allowed Scouts and Scouters attend our Pllgrimage who may not have been able to because the current economic problems... layoffs, underemployment, etc.

The Pilgrimage includes a visit to San Miguel Mission (oldest church in America), Loretto's Chapel (the miraculous staircase), and the Church at Chimayo. In keeping with the Indian culture involved in the lives of Blessed Katera, St Juan Diego and Fr Serra's work along the west coast, our Pilgrimage will visit the Indian cliff dwellings at Bandolier National Monument.

Finally, our Boy Scouts will visit Philmont Scout Ranch where the National Catholic Committee Conference will Occur and an opportunity for our Scouting pilgrims to conduct a Living Rosary in the mountains of New Mexico. Footsteps of the Saints is a religious adventure meant to portray inspiring role models for our Scouts to aspire to in their own faith journey.
