## **Hike for Life Joe Jordan**

Tom Clark has asked if SEAS can sponsor the annual Hike for Life to benefit Loreto House this year.

Several of us had marched in it last year in Denton and expressed some interest in bringing it to Keller.

Our worthy past state deputy, Leo Hanus, who sponsored it last year in Denton is unable to do it again this year and had to drop out suddenly about a week ago.

Since they raised about \$8500 last year, Loreto House has that baked into their budget for this year (fiscal year = calendar year), so they'll be hurting if they don't have someone pick it up. I've talked to the Catholic Respect Life team and we're willing to be "in charge" of the project, but are obviously hoping we can count on the support of the Council and Assemblies, to make it a success.

The whole thing relies on having "hikers" participate and get sponsors to donate money in their name as they hike the day of the event. If was can get a couple of hundred hikers, we should do really well.

I've already gotten commitments from the CRL team, the Squires, the High School Youth (from SEAS, Muenster, Lindsay & Burleson at least), Youth for Life, UNT College Council (mainly a lot of man/woman power), and the Catholic Daughters who are going to help us advertize it by stuffing our materials into their packets for participants in their "Fun Run" duing Fall Fest on Oct. 8.

The Hike was originally planned for Oct. 22 in Denton, but we're probably going to move it to Oct. 15, to avoid the UNT Homecoming.

This will put it the week after our Fall Fest and two weeks after the Life Chain on Oct. 2. This will give us plenty of tme to do our planning and to get the word out, including at two of our major parish events (Life Chain & Fall Fest) and still keep it in Oct. during the Month of Life.

Expect to see more info shortly as we nail it down, but it will most likely be held in Keller on Bear Creek hiking trail / park if we can get City approval.

#### **Keeping Children Safe Class**

Any Knights that are interacting with the youth are required to take the Keeping Children Safe class. It's our responsibility to ensure that all Knights are compliant with the Diocesan requirements. Anyone working with the Squires, Scouts or volunteering with the youth need to take the course. The course is taught multiple times a year at various locations in the diocese. You can check the Diocesan website for more information about the program and see the scheduled classes.

#### **NEED MIDDLE SCHOOL VOLUNTEERS**

The Middle School Youth are looking for volunteers to help lead them closer to Christ. You do not need to be an experienced teacher to come learn about our beautiful faith with our incredible young people! Our volunteers are often heard saying how they intended to volunteer to help our young people but instead have found themselves richly blessed through God's incredibly generosity. We still in dire need of volunteer help in the following capacities:

- 2 men needed to assist with the Pure Love Club, our new Middle School chastity club. Training will be provided by TOBET (Theology of the Body Evangelization Team) on how to talk to youth about chastity. Time commitment is minimal as this group only meets once a month.
- Several adults needed to assist with middle school Bible Study. This year's theme: "Why do Catholics do *That*?" Time commitment is minimal as this group only meets twice a month.
- 7 teachers, 8 aides, and 5 hall monitors for our 4:45 Religious Education class. This year's focus is Sacraments & Prayer, and the entire first semester will be spent on the Mass. Training, lesson plans and continual support are provided. This class meets every Wednesday.
- 6 teachers and 6 aides for our 6:45 Religious Education class. This year's focus is Sacraments & Prayer, and the entire first semester will be spent on the Mass.
   Training, lesson plans and continual support are provided. This class meets every Wednesday.

#### Camp Fort Worth

18 of our youth participated in one of two installments of Camp Fort Worth over the past month. During a week-long 24x7 retreat, they worked with over 100 other youth and adults from the Diocese on various service projects around Fort Worth & Arlington, including building baby beds for Loreto House, building stone retaining walls, cleaning classrooms & restrooms and painting fences around St. Vincent de Paul Parish, visiting and washing cars for the senior citizens at Neustro Hogar Catholic Center in Arlington, playing with the elementary and high school kids at the Boys & Girls Club of Arlington, sorting clothes and school supplies at Mission Arlington, and many other great service projects. In addition, they also attended Mass daily and had time for Eucharistic adoration, reconciliation with Bishop Vann and innumerable opportunities to make new friends from across the diocese as they learned first-hand to imitate our Master Servant.

You should be very proud of our kids and the volunteer Youth Ministers who helped make this happen for them, including Br. Gabe Gutierrez and the many other Knights who helped out.

#### World Youth Day in Muenster

A couple of our youth are fortunate enough to be going to World Youth Day in Spain next week with a group from the Diocese and other parishes, but we do not have our own group going this year.

Not to be left out though, we've arranged to have a special version of WYD here in our Diocese for our kids to make them feel like they're part of the event with the Pope.

We'll be taking our kids up to Muenster to join up with kids from Sacred Heart parish, and St. Joseph's in Lindsay and St. Ann's in Burleson for Mass followed by a concert and Purity Talk by Christian Singer, Rebecca St. James sponsored by the Catholic Daughters in Muenster. After that, we'll have an all-night lock-in with the kids with adoration, Divine Mercy & some fun and games before watching the Papal welcome and closing Mass with Pope Benedict starting at 2:30 a.m. Sunday morning, Aug. 21. We'll finish in the morning by cooking them breakfast and then heading to Mass at 8:30 before heading home to SEAS so they can get some sleep Sunday afternoon.

We plan to put up photos of the kids we know that are there and have a contest for our kids to see who can spot whom in the crowd estimated to be well over 1,000,000 kids in Madrid. Should be lots of fun.
