40 Days for Life Prayer Campaign

Brother Knights,

I am excited to share with you the news of the upcoming 40 Days for Life prayer campaign in Fort Worth. For this year, the fall 40 Days for Life prayer campaign will take place from September 22 thru October 31. If you are unfamiliar, The 40 Days for Life is a 40-day peaceful, prayer campaign focused on bringing about an end to abortion through prayer and fasting, community outreach, and a 40-day, round the clock, prayer vigil kept in front of the Planned Parenthood abortion clinic at 301 South Henderson Street in Fort Worth. If you need additional background information, please see the attached tri-fold brochure about the 40 Days for Life.

As is the case every year, we really need the help and the participation by the Knights of Columbus. I encourage you to sign up for a time slot on our schedule, which is a weekly commitment to be present in prayer on the sidewalk across from Planned Parenthood for that particular hour for each of the weeks of the campaign, which is only a short 6 weeks. You can participate as a Knights of Columbus council or you can come out and pray on your own as an individual. And if you are unable to participate in the prayer vigil on the sidewalk, please join us in prayer at home. Any contribution that you can make is greatly appreciated. We especially need help with the night hours (esp. midnight to 5:00 am) because we try to keep the ladies off of the streets at night.

I would like to also encourage you to attend our Kick-off Rally, which will be held on the first day of the campaign, Wednesday, September 22nd at 7:00 pm on the sidewalk in front

of Planned Parenthood. The speaker for the Kick-off will be Abby Johnson. Abby is the former director of Planned Parenthood in Bryan/College Station that had a conversion experience and left her job last fall during the 40 Days for Life. We are expecting a wonderful, powerful, and uplifting speech to kick-off our 40 Days for Life, and we don't want you to miss it!

Please join us in prayer as we continue our work to bring about an end to abortion. Thank you all for everything that you do to help bring about a culture of life. Please contact me if you need any additional information or have any questions.

Our Seminarians

New Seminarian Gary Picou

August 22, 2010 Dear Jim,

Thank you for your support of the diocese's seminarians in general, and myself in particular. Below is a quick summary of what has led me to return to the seminary after 13 years.

I am originally from Houston, Texas. In addition to my parents, my family consists of a younger sister and two younger brothers. We have lived in Texas and Louisiana depending on where my dad's company sent us. In 1988, I graduated from Tomball High School in Tomball, TX, and then went to the University of Houston for mechanical engineering. I graduated from U of H in 1993. During college, I was discerning whether or not to enter seminary. After college, I elected to submit my application to the Diocese of Galveston-Houston. I was accepted by the Diocese and started my pre-Theology at Holy Trinity Seminary in Iriving, Texas. After two years of pre-Theology, I attended St. Mary's seminary in Houston, Texas. After my Clinical Pastoral Education experience (a lay hospital chaplain) at St. Luke's Hospital in the Houston Medical Center, I left seminary. Some of the reasons were that I questioned what was the role of a parish priest, could I live that role, and what did it mean for me to be a priest. I felt that I could not answer that in seminary, and with the faculties approval, I took a leave of absence. I was only intending about six months to a year for this. Little did I know, it would be thirteen years. After the seminary in 1997, I moved up to the DFW area.

Since I had a degree in engineering, I applied for some jobs in the metroplex. In late 1997, I began my first job as a design engineer. After two years working as a design engineer for a small machine manufacturer, I was laid off. God was watching over me, and led me to an engineering sales support job for a German automation company. I worked for this company for almost nine years in various roles: applications engineer, lead district engineer, and finally as a sales engineer. During this time, I picked St. Michael's parish in Bedford as my home parish. I volunteered in youth ministry, and have stayed involved for the past thirteen years as one of the adult leaders. I have also helped lead Little Rock Scripture Study for the past six years.

In late 2008, my company started having layoffs. These continued through the Spring of 2009. I had survived these, but also had more work after each one. In May of 2009, the company offered a voluntary severance package. My boss called me to let me know that he intended to take the package. Of the eight people in my local sales office, seven of us took the package. I had a choice to make: stay with the company and give up my

work at church or take the package. I took the package. I was looking at transitioning into youth ministry or teaching, so the timing was good for me. But, as I prepared to take the package, God started to direct me to reconsider my life choices. I had been looking at some job websites in my

local school districts, and found a job that I would really like. Once I informed my company that I was taking the package, I went back to the

website, but the job had been filled. I started asking what was my calling.

Some of the youth at my parish, and the adults from bible study had mentioned that I aught to consider the priesthood. I contacted some close friends to ask them to help me discern my future direction. Through them and a priest friend from my seminary days, I contacted Fr. Kyle in the Fort Worth vocation office. With his direction, I visited some seminaries to see if this is where God was calling me at this time.

After visiting three seminaries, and much prayer and support, in November of 2009, I began the application process. I continued to volunteer at St. Michael's, but I informed the staff and the youth group that I had applied. I received much support from them, and this also helped to validate my choice. I completed the application in February of 2010, and in May was accepted as a seminarian for the Diocese of Fort Worth. I will be attending Theological College in Washington, DC for the next few years.

The previous year has been one of much growth. I noticed that for me, the priesthood is about being in a particular relationship with God's people. I cannot wait to return to the Diocese and begin ministering as a priest there.
