Greetings Brother Knights,

I hope this letter finds you and your families well as we enter this Christmas season. I wanted to take this opportunity as we close a very unique calendar year filled with several challenges to thank all of you for your continued support of our Council in numerous ways over the past year.

2020 began normally for Council 1116, with our members staffing the Coffee Shop and running our annual Free Throw Contest, as well as joining together in prayer for Holy Hours, the Novena for Life, and our 5th Sunday Rosary Program. This was in addition to the many other ways our members typically volunteer in the Parish and local community such as the Cot Shelter Program, REY, and various liturgical roles. It was business as usual, but it changed dramatically (as did so many aspects of our lives) shortly after our Mardi Gras Party and Chalice of Salvation appearance.

We began soon after the virus outbreak to hold our meetings virtually, while trying to serve as best we could in the areas of Faith, Family, Community, and Life. In fact, we were so successful in doing so, that we were able to earn a Columbian Award for the Faith in Action programs that we were able to run despite the various challenges. During this time, our members were integral in the essential Take and Eat program, as well as at the Easthampton Community Center. We also had members step up and provide multiple services for vulnerable members of the community as part of our No Neighbor Left Behind outreach, and our insurance Agent (and Council member) Bob Sass never ceased to provide his excellent services for our Insurance and Financial needs. Though limited, we were able to persist in prayer in various and creative ways as a Council throughout the lockdown and thereafter, the importance of which cannot be over-stated.

Though we were thankfully able to hold another successful Pierogi Sale this Fall, we were forced to cancel reliable fundraisers like the Scholarship Breakfast and Polka Party, as well as charity events like the Mother's Day Rose Sale and Tootsie Roll Drive. Despite these setbacks and therefore limited funds, we were still able make donations to the needy thanks in large part to the generosity of our members. We were also able to purchase a travelling mass kit as an ordination gift for Rev. Valentine Nworah, as well as smaller gifts for 2 other newly ordained priests who we've been sponsoring through RSVP, and support other worthy causes like The Bethlehem House and Wreaths Across America.

After 7 weeks of being deprived of the Sacraments, we were finally able to resume public masses beginning on May 23. That weekend, in addition to producing an instructional video, our members began assisting at all 6 weekend masses by ushering before, assisting at communion during, and cleaning/disinfecting after each one; a process that has continued for each subsequent weekend and holy day since. Thank you to the many men who we have been able to continually depend on to provide these services. Our council is very blessed to have you.

Unfortunately, we are not able to serve refreshments at this time, but we do still hold our 50/50 raffle towards the end of the meeting. We have many new State raffle tickets available for those interested in those as well. Please note that our meetings are socially distanced, and face coverings are required for the time being.


