When I received the May issue of Columbia magazine, I was pleasantly surprised to see a picture of Babe Ruth and Lou Gehrig on the cover. The article inside described baseball's postseason tours in the 1920s sponsored by local Knights of Columbus councils. These tours took place from Providence, Rhode Island to Los Angeles. In addition to helping grow the national pastime these tours raised money for many charitable funds.

This article, along with the sizzling temperatures of the past few days confirmed to me that summertime is upon us. I reminisced about "the boys of summer" and how I had spent very enjoyable but far too few days at the ballpark. Growing up in South Louisiana, the closest professional baseball team was in Houston.
