Grand Knight's Message

Brothers, Families, and Friends of Council 367,

One of the longest parables in the New Testament may have deep meaning for us Knights. It also might be a bit troubling if it is interpreted too narrowly. The contradiction in what the parable means should not be dissolving one for Knights. Instead, it should be a call to action for us. That's the way I interpret it. I believe we must understand it that way or all is lost. Let me explain.

In Matthew 20: 1-16 Jesus details a long parable titled "The Workers in the Vineyard." Recall that the story is about a landowner who goes out early in the morning to negotiate with laborers to work in his vineyard. He offers to pay them a day's wage for toiling in the field all day. Later he hires a second group and offers the same wage. Late in the day he finds the last group of laborers and offers them the same full day's wage to work in the vineyard for a much shorter period of time. At the end of the day he pays them all the exact same wage. Those who worked the entire day are paid the same as those who only work an hour. The early workers grumble that they should be paid more. The landowner explains that he is free to do as he wishes with his money. He tells the worker, "Take what is yours and go." The moral of the parable is the very famous statement: "Thus, the last will be first, and the first will be last." That's a gut punch to the faithful. Maybe not though.

A generally accepted interpretation of the parable is that God is the landowner and we are the workers. We "negotiate" our "wage" with God either early or late in the "day" as we see fit.

Grand Knight's Message *cont.*

God gets to do what he wants and, as such, it is by His grace that we are all "paid" the same in the end. It's only by God's grace that we are paid at all. The idea that some might be paid the same for less work is fundamentally antithetical to us. That's especially true of us modern Americans. We typically believe that the riches go to those who work the longest and the hardest. However, that's not what God is telling us in this parable. We need to accept it and deal with it. But, it's humbling to do so. That's part of the lesson for us.

As Knights, WE must be the first ones who sign up to work for God. WE must be the ones who do the hard work all day in the "vineyard" for the same "wage" as lesser laborers. WE must be the ones who gladly accept our "pay" at the end of the day. WE must be the ones who do not grumble about it. WE must be the ones who gladly accept our reward in the end. WE must be the ones who trust that God's grace will be bestowed on us for our labors. WE must be the ones who lead by example and do all of those things first so that others will follow our example. If WE don't, who will? WE MUST.

It is my opinion that the proper interpretation of Matthew's parable is that us Knights have been called up to set the example for laboring for God so that others might emulate us. We are called upon to do that. I believe that Knights are the ones who must be the first and hardest workers for God. We also have to believe that God's grace will reward us in the end despite what we might think is our excess of good work for Him
