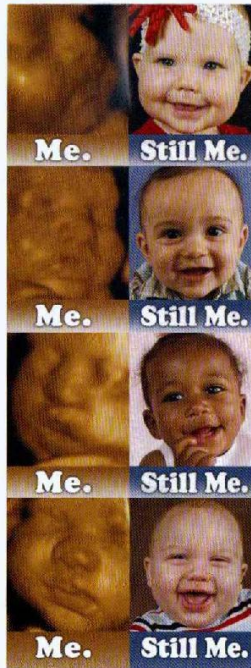
We have a busy agenda ahead in the coming weeks, refer to the activity calendar and as always – get engaged and get involved!

A baby, is a baby, is a baby.

When a human life first begins, it is tiny and helpless. But even at this early stage, the small fertilized egg needs shelter and food, just like any other person. The mother is able to provide this safe place in the womb, and the baby starts to grow.

At first, the *fetus* (Latin, meaning "the young while in the womb") does not look much like what we would think a "baby" should look like, but all the information from their eye and hair color, to their unique facial structure, is complete. It only takes a few weeks for their unique genes to show through. Even before the mom's belly begins to grow, the baby has tiny fingers and toes.² And before the first trimester is over, the little baby is hiccupping, frowning, squinting, furrowing the brow, pursing the lips, touching the face, breathing (without air), stretching, opening the mouth, yawning, and sucking.³

While babies go through many changes in the womb, they are still the same person before and after they are born. They have the same heart, the same genetics, and the same growing mind. They even have the same facial expressions they learned to make while in the womb!⁴ The born baby will still rely on his/her mother for protection and sustenance and they will still grow and change just like he/she did in the womb. While many people believe there is a significant difference, the unborn child and the born child are only separated by where they are, not by who they are.

Every child is unique and beautiful in God's eyes, whether they are born or unborn. Their value and worth is immeasurable, but their vulnerability is also great. You can help take a stand to defend these unborn people by supporting your local pro-life groups, reaching out to those in crisis pregnancies, and praying for the unborn and their mothers.

Did you know?

An unborn baby's heart starts beating just 21 days after conception and will beat 52 million times in the womb.¹ That heart will then beat, on average, 3.1 billion times in the lifetime.²

When an unborn baby is just 10 weeks old, their fingerprints start to develop. These unique shapes will stay with them for life.³

At 11 weeks old, an unborn baby starts practicing breathing by moving the amniotic fluid in and out of their lungs.⁴ The baby will need the practice as the average human breathes 630 million times in a lifetime!⁵

After about 13 weeks in the womb, a baby can smile and may even make expressions like their parents.⁶ While there is no way of knowing how many times a person may smile in their lifetime, hopefully it is in the millions for this little person!
