

ST MARK'S CRIMINAL JUSTICE MINISTRY

Much should be our belief in the words spoken by Pope Francis when he said that showing mercy to those who have strayed can be life changing. "Mercy overcomes every wall, every obstacle and can instill new life and hope in others".

In September 2011 we began to make our first visits to the Briscoe Unit in Dilley, Texas. We found that there had not been any type of Catholic service in seven years. In our first visits we brought a spark of hope for the inmates. The spark turned into light when we made the commitment to provide a weekly Communion service with Liturgy of the **Word**, of the **Mass**, and of the **Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA).** So far, Bishop Mike (shown below celebrating mass) has baptized 14 inmates and brought to the sacraments of Reconciliation, Holy Eucharist, and Conformation to a total of 18 inmates (shown below with Deacon Robert Leibrecht, Bishop Mike, and Father Ruben).

We also had inmates graduate with a certificate from The Oblate School of Theology Pastoral Formation Institute. This is an in depth two year course study of our Church History; Prayer; Christian Life and Morality; and the Bible, Creed, and Sacraments.

Meals for about 150 inmates and team members are to be served this month (Fri. Nov. 4) at the Briscoe Unit in Dilley, Texas. Many of the 25 participants serving this effort are Knights from Council 7613.

SILVER ROSE ARRIVAL – OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE

Since 1960, the Silver Rose program, has gathered Knights and Columbian Squires from Mexico, the United States, and Canada under the mantle of Our Lady of Guadalupe, the Patroness of the Americas. In the mid-1990s, it was adopted as a Supreme Council initiative, which grew to encompass multiple pilgrimage routes and reaffirm the Order's commitment to the sanctity of human life.

The roses, symbols of unity among the peoples in the Americas, are also symbols of the pro-life movement of which the Knights are heavily involved. The program's devotion to Our Lady of Guadalupe stems from the fact that she is considered the patroness of the pro-life movement.

In 2001 Supreme Knight Carl Anderson expanded this program by beginning the "Running of the Rose" from the 119th Annual Meeting of the Supreme Council in Toronto. "The Running of the Rose' is a perfect program for the Knights of Columbus" said Supreme Knight Anderson. "Through it we honor not only Our Lady of Guadalupe and express the unity of the Order, but we also reaffirm the Order's dedication to the sanctity of human life. It is to the Blessed Mother that we turn in prayer as we work to end the Culture of Death that grips our Society. As we think in terms of 'One Life, One Rose,' it is most appropriate that we turn to Our Lady of Guadalupe who made known her will through Juan Diego and the miracle of the roses."

The Knights of Columbus remains firmly committed to defending the right to life of every human being, from the moment of conception to natural death. Countless councils and individual Knights conduct projects aimed to build a culture of life in their individual communities. One of the most successful of the Order's initiatives in this area is the Ultrasound Initiative through which councils (both state and local) partner with the Supreme Council in provide sharing the cost of purchasing ultrasound machines for pregnancy resource centers.

What we choose to do, or not do, about abortion, euthanasia, human cloning and embryonic research impacts lives for generations to come. Take action now and support a culture that values human life at all stages. It is to the Blessed Mother that we turn in prayer as we work to end the Culture of Death that grips our society.


