New Year's Resolutions

The 2012 liturgical year starts this Advent on the weekend of November 26^{th} and 27^{th} . This is our church's "New Years Day". Happy New Years!

I suspect all of you have made a New Year's resolution before. Heaven knows I have. "I'm going to lose weight" or "I'm going to exercise every single day all year long" or "I'm going to quit smoking".

We typically do this at the beginning of a new year because – well, since it's the start of a new year, I guess we think it's a good time to start anew And, it is.

"Starting anew" or being "born again" is a recurring theme in Christianity. We are born anew in our Baptism by Christ. So how about we make a New Year's resolution related to our faith this coming year?

I propose we resolve to embrace fully the new translation of the Latin Mass.

I know a lot of people don't like change – and many wonder why we need to make this change. Well – let me give you my take on it. And I'll start by discussing a guy names Mark

We start a new series of readings this Advent – this year will be from Cycle B, which uses mostly the Gospel according to Mark.

I like the Gospel of Mark – I really do. Mark is generally believed to be the oldest Gospel account of the life of Jesus. The author, Mark the Evangelist, is the only gospel writer who personally knew Jesus. He was believed to be one of the original 70 disciples who were sent forth by Jesus.

Later in life, Mark the Evangelist wrote down the oral recounting of the last days of Jesus as told to him by Saint Peter. So, if this gospel is the oral account our first pope gave of the life and death and life again of Jesus, it's probably pretty close to being accurate.

I personally like being as close to the source as possible, and Mark is certainly that. I suppose that is why I like the new translation of the Mass that we begin using this Advent.

Having been "exposed" to Latin in high school, I always knew the English version we'd been using since 1970 wasn't a very good literal translation. To me, much of the formality and grace of the Latin Mass was lost in the English translation. Jesus is "consubstantial" with the Father, not "one in being" with the Father. We lost the very familiar "mea culpa, mea culpa, mea maxima culpa" that drives home that our sins are wholly our choice and fault.

I understand how we got to where we got. When the old translation was done back in the 1960's, the translators were in a big hurry. And the direction they were given was to translate the Latin into what they thought it meant in everyday English, not a literal word for word translation.

The translation we have been using is a "dynamically equivalent" translation – an interpretation of the original Latin. The new Mass is a "formally equivalent" translation. So it is much closer to the ancient language of the Church.
