In a Council meeting several months ago, the idea was raised about having Knights of Columbus vanity license plates produced and made available to members of our Council and Assembly. The plates are made of aluminum and overprinted as shown above. The plates have 2 mounting holes near the top for easy mounting. There are also 2 mounting holes at the bottom of the plate. If it is desired to also use the lower holes on the plate, there is a simple pop-out to make these holes apparent. Some modern vehicles may not appear to have mounting holes on the front bumpers but since most cars are sold in all states and many states require front license plates, there are almost always 2 lightly marked spots on the front bumper that are also pop-outs. The plates are available for \$12 and can still be obtained from Brother Knight Nic DiGiacomo, who is in charge of this project. Don't delay since a modest number of plates were produced.

One of our Brother Knights made the Honor Flight to Washington DC

Our Brother, Sir Knight Ed Doyle, was a veteran of World War II and was selected to participate in an Honor Flight to Washington D.C. and to tour the National Monuments there commemorating all of our veterans from this War. The commentary that follows was provided by Ed Doyle.

"The Honor flight by Ed Doyle

I have never been in such a special 'thank you' as I received on the 18^{th} of September. I was asked by my physician to participate in an air trip to

Washington to see the War Memorial. He did not tell me that I would be accompanied by 55 other service men **from WWII.** I was asked to arrive at the Municipal Building in Stuart at 4:30 in the morning of the 18th. As I arrived, I was surprised to see a large group of people signing up. I was introduced to my guardian, a very nice woman, named Donna, who turned out to be president of the Women's Aux. of the Veterans of Foreign Wars in Stuart. Each GI in the group had a guardian who paid their own way to the tune of \$400. As we left the building to board the luxury buses, we were treated to a send off by police and firemen, who clapped and bid us a safe trip and added a 'thank you' for our service. As we left the area in the buses, we were led by a sheriff's car with blazing lights and a squad of motorcycles. We went to the VA Hospital in West Palm Beach for breakfast. Again, clapping and 'thank yous'. After breakfast the buses took us to the Palm Beach airport to board our plane. As we debarked and entered the airport people were lined up along the route with a band and more clapping and 'thank yous'. We were given round trip tickets to Washington via Baltimore. As our plane taxied down the runway, a pair of fire trucks shot columns of water over the plane.

When we landed in Washington, a pair of fire trucks again shot streams of water over the plane. As we entered the terminal, passengers and airport personnel were lined up clapping and saying thank you. We were then loaded into luxury buses and given box lunches as we toured Washington on our way to the War Memorial. Upon arriving at the Memorial we debarked and toured the site. We then boarded the buses and were taken to the Iwo Jima Monument. There we had a group picture taken and then embarked for the airport and the flight home. We were again given box lunches. We arrive back at the Stuart location around 8 PM and I arrived home about 10:30 PM. What a wonderful day. Please note that nowhere did they cheer. Instead, they politely clapped and said Thank You."

For the reader's information, "the Honor Flight Network is a non-profit organization created solely to honor America's veterans for all their sacrifices. We transport our heroes to Washington, D.C. to visit and reflect at their memorials. Top priority is given to the senior veterans- World War II survivors, along with those other veterans who may be terminally ill.

Of all of the wars in recent memory, it was World War II that truly threatened our very existence as a nation- and as a culturally diverse, free society. Now, with over one thousand World War II veterans dying each day, our time to express our thanks to these brave men and women is running out" (taken from the Honorflight.org website).
