Souls in Purgatory



The month of November is dedicated to the **Souls in Purgatory**, whose feast is celebrated on November 2. With the exception of the last Sunday, November falls during the liturgical season known as **Ordinary Time** and is represented by the liturgical color green.

According to **Catholic Church doctrine**, **Purgatory** is an intermediate state after physical death in which those destined for heaven "undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven". Only those who die in the state of grace but have not in life reached a sufficient level of holiness can be in Purgatory, and therefore no one in Purgatory will remain forever in that state or go to hell.

The word "Purgatory", derived through **Anglo-Norman** and **Old French** from the Latin word *purgatorium*, has come to refer also to a wide range of historical and modern conceptions of postmortem suffering short of everlasting damnation, and is used, in a non-specific sense, to mean any place or condition of suffering or torment, especially one that is temporary.

The Catholic Church teaches that the fate of those in purgatory can be affected by the actions of the living. The practice of **indulgences** helps the faithful as remission before God, through the mediation of the Church, of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven. Indulgences may be obtained for oneself, or on behalf of the dead.

As we dedicate this month for the souls in purgatory, let's pray for our beloved deceased and the soul of the faithful as we pray:

O Lord, who art ever merciful and bounteous with Thy gifts, look down upon the suffering souls in purgatory. Remember not their offenses and negligences, but be mindful of Thy loving mercy, which is from all eternity. Cleanse them of their sins and fulfill their ardent desires that they may be made worthy to behold Thee face to face in Thy glory. May they soon be united with Thee and hear those blessed words which will call them to their heavenly home: "Come, blessed of My Father, take possession of the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world."

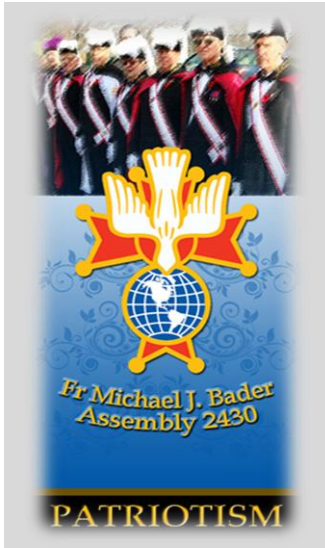
