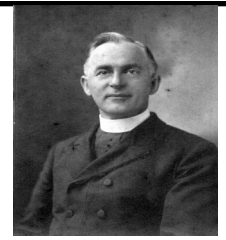

Chancellor's Chatter

The **Incentive Car Raffle** Ended on October 8 with the delivery of 2,000 tickets by your Council Officers at the Columbus Day Ball held this year at the BWI Marriot Hotel and Conference Center. Thank you all so much for responding to our mail request to purchase tickets. This year's response was a big success and could not have happened without your response and the small army of Brother Knights and Lady Knights who stuffed envelopes with tickets for mailing one evening in early September. Our assembly line would have made Henry Ford proud.

What made us proud was the response from Brother Knights (one from as far away as Baltimore), friends, family, clergy, a local dentist office and our BINGO patrons. The \$1,200 that stays at the Council will be used in many of our charity endeavors. \$800 went to the Knights of Columbus State Scholarship programs.

The **Tootsie Roll Program** for the benefit of the Campaign for People with Intellectual Disabilities continues; a number of successful events that have raised over \$1,200. The Grocery store collections have been well supported by Brother Knights (*including a visit by Maryland Men's Basketball Coach Mark Turgeon at the Kensington Safety seen here*). A total of 20 Brother Knights/Lady Knights, friends and family donated at least two hours of their Saturday mornings during September and October.

St. Marianne Cope was a Sister of the Third Order of Saint Francis based in Syracuse, NY. She is also a beatified American Saint by Pope Benedict XVI. After her birth in Germany, the family immigrated to America in 1839 and settled in Utica, NY. When her father died she went to work in a textile factory with her other siblings to support the family. Achieving maturity she sought a novitiate with the Sisters of St. Francis. Large numbers of German-speaking immigrants were arriving so she became a teacher at a school for children. She also helped direct the opening of the first two Catholic hospitals in Central New York. The hospital charter stated that medical care be given to patients regardless of race or creed. She arranged for students from the former Geneva Medical College to work in these Catholic hospitals. She was instrumental in the medical school moving and it was renamed the College of Medicine at Syracuse University.

By 1883, she had become the Superior General of her Order. It was at this time she received a plea for help from King Kalakaua of Hawaii. He requested help with the leprosy sufferers on the islands. The King had already been declined by over 50 other religious institutes. Mother Marianne and six other Sisters of St. Francis accepted the challenge and left Syracuse in 1883 for the long journey to Hawaii.

Mother Marianne managed the hospital on Oahu. The next year she established the Malulani Hospital on the island of Maui. Soon she assumed an active role helping the lepers on the island of Molo-kai after the death of their pastor, Fr. Damien. Mother Marianne started schools for children of patients, provided new colorful clothing for them, and maintained an continued presence in the islands until she died at the age of 80 years in 1918. She was declared a saint by Pope Benedict in 2012.

November 10 is the 241st Birthday of both the U.S. Marine Corps and the Navy. The following day, November 11, is our National Holiday: Veterans' Day. It is also remembered as Armistice Day, the last day of World War I. An armistice ended four years of combat operations at 11 a.m. This is a day to reflect on the sacrifices made for the country by all our military forces since that long ago date of 1775.

There was a lot of excitement for our bowlers recently. Barbara Dailey, who has high average for women (117) had a terrific game with five strikes and one spare. She ended with a 184 game, that's **67 pins over her average!** Her name is now "up in lights" at the White Oak bowling alley. Congratulations, Barbara!
