Dear Brother Knights:

Our Membership Training meetings have been completed in all five of the dioceses and I am very pleased with the turnout and participation of the Membership Chairmen, Retention Chairmen, Grand Knights, and Council Officers who attended. I hope that the information presented will assist you in recruiting new members and retaining our existing members.

The Supreme Council FAST START Program (which we renamed THE SUMMER OF PLUS 1) was very successful and, again, I thank Grand Knights and District Deputies across the state for their enthusiastic participation in bringing new members into our Order.

July, 2017 saw an intake of 139 new members (our goal was 130) and August, 2017 was even better with 151 new members (our goal was 143). We did not make our September, 2017 goal (110 new members towards a goal of 153) but our First Quarter total was 400 new members (with a goal of 426)...that is 93.89%. Please continue to schedule Admission Degrees and recruit to those degrees. If necessary, use the DVD...do not make a candidate wait for an Admission Degree.

The Fast Start program was so successful that the Supreme Council has decided to continue this program for the remainder of the Columbian Year so I am pleased to welcome you to the <u>AUTUMN OF</u> **PLUS 1!**

Looking back over the past five years, our monthly membership goals are:

- October, 2017 286
- November, 2017 270
- December, 2017 245

These numbers may appear high, but with 71 Districts in New Jersey, we can make these goals if each district brings in 4 new members a month. That is a challenge to the District Deputies to work with the Grand Knights and recruit new members to our Order.

Highlighted Programs of the Month

KEEP CHRIST IN CHRISTMAS POSTER CONTEST

Brother Knights,

Year after year we see ourselves being bombarded by the rampant growth of secularism within the society in which we live. We and our children live in a society where Christmas has become for many - especially children – an ever growing materialistic erosion of Christian values. But even more disturbing, is the genuine denial of and aggressive anti-Christian attack upon the spiritual basis of the true meaning of Christmas - Christ's birthday.

To counter this disturbing trend, the Knights of Columbus has again announced its Keep Christ in Christmas poster contest. This program - similar to the Substance Abuse Awareness Poster Contest - allows young people to engage their creative talents and imaginations while fostering and promoting an understanding of the true, spiritual meaning of Christmas.

Contest entrants compete in one of three age groups—ages 5 through 7, ages 8 through 10, and 11 through 14. Some schools may have different age brackets for their elementary and middle schools. In these cases it may be appropriate to group students by grade rather than age. Sponsoring councils should use their own judgment in deciding how to group participants. (Each Council, Diocesan, and State competition may have up to 6 winning entries – first and second place winners in each age group.)

Judging teams should be composed of students, Knights, teachers, administrators, council Chaplain, pastor, etc.

- A 100-point scoring system will be used to determine the winners: •
- Slogan 30 points: How clearly is the theme presented?
- Visuals 30 points: How well do the visuals convey the message?
- Overall Impact 40 points: How effective was the poster in capturing your attention and causing you to reflect on the topic at hand?

The Coloring books are available in many different titles, 19 in total. They are both educational and fun for the children. Perhaps your Council could donate the coloring books to the children of the CCD program at your parishes, as well as giving them out at the children's Christmas Party or Breakfast with Santa at your Parish. The order form and titles are available in the Grand Knights Manual given to all Grand Knights at the June Grand Knights Orientation meeting. Contact the Keep Christ Before Us State Chairman, John A Gazis, FDD for more information.

Also, the "Keep Christ in Christmas" Card Program is an excellent way to get out the message that **Christ IS Christmas.** This is an evangelization program that is chaired by <u>Pete Kudless, PGK,</u>

The focus of this program is to facilitate getting back to the main reason we celebrate Christmas, the birth of Jesus Christ. The cards get the true meaning of Christmas out to the people the cards are sent to. All that is needed for a Council to get started is to fill out a council contact form (copy attached) and forward it to the State Chairman whose contact information is listed on the bottom of the contact form.

All orders for NJ Councils are forwarded to the State Chairman with payment for the order. The State Chairman processes each individual order to initiate order fulfillment. All orders are shipped directly to the ordering Council. There are no minimum orders.

Currently, in addition to English, cards are offered in Italian, Polish, Ukrainian, Spanish, French and Tagalog, as well as cards with African-American and Native American Madonna and Child depictions.

Order forms are available on the State Council web site or by contacting the State Chairman. Orders must be **received** no later than Black Friday for guaranteed delivery before Christmas.

Did you know that one organ and tissue donor can save up to 8 lives and restore health to 50 others? Sadly, though, over 4,000 NJ residents are waiting for a life-saving organ transplant and 97 people died last year while waiting for a donor at one of the 6 transplant centers in NJ. Although 95% of Americans say they support organ donation, only 33% of NJ residents and about 40% of Americans are registered donors.

Therefore, to encourage NJ Knights of Columbus members and their families to become organ and tissue donors, the NJ State Council Organ Donor Program aims to educate members, dispel any myths surrounding organ and tissue donation, and inspire members to spread the message to their families and friends.

Remember, 732/ 504-7496 - "We Never Close!" As webmaster, the buck stops with me. I delegate as needed. For the most part, I post all Degrees, all up-coming and past events, and all forms and directories – and all updates or corrections to same.

All general inquiries should be directed to me, first

Now, my "24/7" policy means I answer my phone around the clock. Although I spend most of my waking hours at my computer(s), I do not have a voice telling me "You've Got Mail!"

Mail is checked daily, usually before the sun rises; at various intervals during the day; and when I stop for the day – whenever that might be.

IF your mail is urgent, call me and tell me to check my mail and I will take the necessary action.

Former District Deputy John Gazis, in addition to being Chairman of various State Programs, serves as Assistant Webmaster and handles other duties at my request. This includes all log-in requests, and taking and posting photographs of State events.

As State Directory Editor John also handles all updates to the State Directory – but changes MUST be made utilizing the on-line State Directory Reporting Forms.

Per protocol from State & Supreme, all requests for Degrees MUST be made utilizing the appropriate on-line form. That request is automatically directed to your assigned Aide to the State Deputy – you should allow 24-48 hours for that form to be verified and sent to me for posting. This also may take an additional 24-48 hours.

If you have a Degree needing posting in less than 7 days you should contact the Aide after filing the form.

<u>Help Wanted</u>: If anyone would like to assist with data entry tasks, please give me a call. My motto, "I never work anyone harder than I work myself!"

When you see a member of the armed forces, shake their hand and say "thank you for your service."

It is also a good time to think about your neighbor, especially the elderly neighbors that can't always get things done around their home, or get to the stores for themselves. Offer to take them shopping, or to the doctor's office. Ask them to join you for a meal, either in your home or take them to the diner, Jersey has a ton of those. When cooking dinner for your family, make a little extra and bring them a plate of home cooking, they will appreciate that immensely.
