The renewal of obligations will be at our Jan 2 Assembly meeting. Like last year the other two Assemblies in the area were invited to participate in the renewal with us. This year based on the new 4th degree uniform, Officers will wear a dark suit and tie. Continuing with some information on the new 4th degree uniform.

The Beret: The beret is not designed to be worn "off the rack: or directly from the package. The beret must first be shaved and shaped to present the sharpest form and fit properly. The entire process for shaping your beret will take a couple of days to complete, allowing for time for the beret to dry after shaping. There is a two-page memo of instruction that I have on how wet, shave, form and size properly the beret. Once you get your beret contact me and I will give you a copy of the instructions.

The Beret Pin: The medallion that is part of the beret has two pins that you stick into the front part of the beret over the left eye. When applying the medallion please be careful that when applying pressure to secure the pins that you apply the pressure straight down and not at an angle or you will bend the pin. I would also recommend that you get pin clasp that are of a solid surface as to not have the pins dig into your forehead.

Service Baldric and Swords: Service Baldric, Swords and White Gloves will continue to be used for color corps activities. The assembly has Service Baldric and Swords that you will still be able to use if you do not personally own them. Remember 7 November is election day.....VOTE





"It was about how relationships can change people," Litzinger says. "It realiy didn't feature Down syndrome as much as how relationships can change people for the better."

A resident of Louisville, Ky., DeSanctis was chosen for the role of Produce after a national search was conducted. Producer Milan Chakraborty met DeSanctis, who was 22 at the time, after the advocacy group Down Syndrome of Louisville suggested he might be right for the part. In the film, Produce is a young man with Down syndrome, who is working at a local grocery store when he meets Calvin Campbell, played by Kristoffer Polaha, and the two become friends. Campbell is a professional baseball player who has been sent into early retirement because of panic attacks at the plate. "He is struggling to take care of his teenage daughter and having alcohol

"He is strugging to take care of his teenage daughter and having alcohol problems," DeSanctis says. "He comes into a grocery store and he meets my character, who works in the produce section.

"He and I become friends. Through an unlikely friendship, my character changes his character's life."

DeSanctis was uniquely suited for the role, having participated in drama, choir and broadcast journalism in high school.

He was working as a host for local events that supported people with Down syndrome. When DeSanctis landed the film role, it was as much an adventure for his parents, Bill and Julie, as it was for him.

"I haven't acted professionally but I did a little stage acting back in high school in drama class," DeSanctis says. "I also did a cooking segment back in high school in a broadcast."

Like every other actor, DeSanctis had to audition for the role. "I was up against 30 other people," he says. "When it gets time to promote the movie, you have to have someone who has the personality to promote it. My personality won the part for me." Despite long days of filming, DeSanctis thrived.
