# Chaplain's Reflection **Divorce**

Jesus affirms the absolute sanctity of marriage. Jesus does this because God, who wants only the best for us, wants us to be happy. When a marriage goes wrong, the ensuing divorce is a devastating life experience. It leaves everyone financially poorer. Co-parenting from separate homes is a daunting proposition. So mature couples that make the agonizing decision to divorce do so only as a last resort.

A strong marriage is its own reward. But, as Christians we need to reach out to our divorced brethren in love. Every couple that divorces never imagined on their wedding day that their marriage would ever end. It is too easy for those who have never walked in their shoes, have never experienced the desperation and sorrow of a failed marriage, to believe that "they could have done something to save it."

Although some marriages fail due to unforeseeable circumstances, most fail because spouses did not choose each other wisely and were unable to overcome the ensuing difficulties. When marriages fail, it is beyond the control of God. Assume that a divorcing couple has tried or considered anything you might suggest. Understand that it is not a simple matter of forgiveness. Forgiveness is a freeing of the heart, it is not the same as a pardon. Give your divorced friends and acquaintances the benefit of the doubt.

Marriages fail for many reasons. Most of us think of adultery, addiction and abuse as the usual causes, but these are only symptoms of a bigger problem. The real reason behind most failed marriages is simple indifference, often on the part of one spouse. There is no way a husband or wife can individually save a marriage. When a marriage fails, no amount of effort, enabling or denial will save it.

God's ways are not our ways. God does not condem any of us for past failures in our lives. So when a marriage fails, God suffers with the couple and offers His grace to lead them to a better life.

Being freed from an impossible, dysfunctional marriage can release one spiritually, mentally and emotionally to become the person God created them to be so that their personal relationship with God can blossom.

The line between a successful and failed marriage is very thin. The very same pressures some couples may endure may break other couples. There but for the grace of God go I. Healthy marriages don't just happen, every marriage needs constant care. Marriage takes a lot of work.

The marriage covenant with our earthly spouse ends when this life ends. Jesus tells us that there is no marriage in heaven. Marriage is an earthly institution with a heavenly purpose. Marriage is a taste of the love that has existed from all eternity within the Holy Trinity. Marriage demands that we give up our selfish tendencies, to care for another as we would care for ourselves. Marriage is a foreshadowing of our eternal relationship with God and with one another.

God still loves us even if our marriage fails. Jesus showed us this in the story of His encounter with the woman of Samaria at Jacob's well who had been married five times and was now living with yet another man. Jesus' tenderness toward her and his sympathy for her situation are apparent. Jesus sought her out, knowing that only a woman living in shame would draw water from a well at that time of day. And Jesus wanted to be alone with her as he sent his disciples away to get lunch in the town.

Jesus never spoke to this woman or any other hurting person in ways that increased their pain. He offered this divorcée "living water," himself, which was what she had been searching for in all her relationships. All members of our Catholic faith community should do the same.
