Thought for November

Sacrifice and suffering can separate you somewhat from the world. But then you are wandering in another place. However, if you take the trouble to look with your heart instead of your eyes it will be easier to see God now that the world is further away. In a quiet place away from the world it is much easier to be close to God.

Many people have not often been in a quiet place. Some search for such a place. Monks and nuns put themselves in quiet places just to be close to God. That way they can and often do experience joy as they join their spirits to Jesus. Such a life is not easy at first. People get up early in monasteries and convents to attend mass and then to pray and then to work. They voluntarily separate themselves from the world.

In the world people look for pleasure and for happiness. They rarely find joy. But best of all is joy. Joy comes only from God. The whole idea of the life God gives us is to be with him when we die. Although it is the only place we can show our love for God, the world is a problem for us. There are temptations and distractions. God in His goodness takes care of us. And one of the ways he does is to separate us from the world at times by sending sufferings to us, but never more than we can bear. He quiets the world to give us an opportunity to start to look for Him.
