The Symbols of Baptism - The Church has always permitted and encouraged the baptism of infants. Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me!" (Mark 10:14). And we recognize that nothing we can do, no decision we can make, no insight we can conjure up with our own intelligence, is able to redeem our souls and free us from sin. For that, only God's grace will suffice. And that grace is an entirely free gift from God – unconditional, available to all, won by the price paid on the cross by our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. And when we bring a helpless little baby to be baptized, that's what we are acknowledging.

In the actual ritual for baptism, this is symbolized in more than one way. In the first place, the newly baptized baby is given a little cloak, a white garment that represents the new, sinless life of grace that God grants to us when he adopts us as his children. The baby receives the cloak; it comes from the community of faith; no one is self-sufficient in the realm of salvation. And a similar symbol is found in the baptismal candle, which is lit during the ceremony from the Easter candle. We cannot give ourselves the light of God's wisdom; we must receive it from our Savior. In fact, that's why we call him "Savior" - we need him; we cannot save ourselves on our own.
