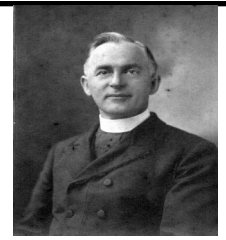

## Chaplain's Reflection We Are All Suffering Servants

The prophet Isaiah foretold the future redemptive action of the Son of God through the imagery of "the Suffering Servant." The Son of God would give His life as an offering for sin to accomplish the will of the Lord. But this message is also directed toward us. It is a very powerful message regarding the efficacy of redemptive suffering.

Redemptive suffering is the means by which one person can suffer for another and that suffering can be redemptive for someone else. Unjust suffering is that which we endure through no fault of our own or despite our best efforts to fix a situation. This differs from the suffering that results from our own poor life choices, sinful or otherwise, although that suffering can also be redemptive.

We can see the power of redemptive suffering played out every day. Mahatmas Gandhi and Martin Luther King Jr. both surrendered their lives for the benefit of others as they used the power of nonviolent resistance to start a redemptive process to bring about changes that Our Lord wants to see in our societal structures of sin.

But what you may not have considered is that each of us has this same capacity to accomplish the will of the Lord through our own redemptive suffering. It may be big things or it may be small things. But if we "offer it up," that suffering will also accomplish the will of the Lord.

There are many situations in our lives that we have the opportunity to "offer it up:" a difficult family situation, the pain of leaving an abusive situation, a job loss, a financial setback, a crime committed against us or our property, a disabling accident or the terminal illness of a loved one. While God expects us to do everything in our power to make things better, some things cannot be fixed. And it is those things which cause unjustified suffering that will release a redemptive power in our lives.

Through His suffering, Jesus would justify many. As a faithful and sinless servant, undeserving of suffering, Jesus could and did liberate others. We too can liberate Others when we patiently endure the suffering that

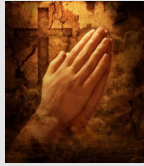

occurs through no fault of our own.

We also are called to serve the many who are sinners who may cause us suffering. We are called to bear our sufferings patiently and lovingly, so as to take away the sufferings of others. Like Jesus, we are called to pay a ransom, sometimes with our lives, for the benefit of others.

Like Jesus, Gandhi and King paid the price that should have been paid by their aggressors, but they took it on and made it go away. They did not respond in typical human fashion by passing on their suffering and continuing the cycle of violence. Like Jesus, they endured and this has unleashed great redemptive power.

The battle against sin and evil, and the pursuit of any greater good always includes unjustified suffering. Satan does not give up easily. Agents of change will always suffer because they must change structures of sin.

But this battle is not only about nation states. It is also about the domestic church and the family. The fight against domestic, spousal and sexual abuse also requires the acceptance of unjustified suffering in order to receive the great redemptive power that can come from confronting it.

Each of us endures unjustified suffering and some endure it far more than others. Nonetheless, each of us has the power to patiently endure the undeserved suffering in our lives to unleash these same great redemptive powers that Jesus showed us on the Cross.

Just as Jesus accepted the role of the "suffering servant" for our redemption, we too can embrace the role of a "suffering servant" for our own good, for the good of our families, for the good of our neighbor and for the good of the world.

## FR. ROSENSTEEL 2021 PICNIC

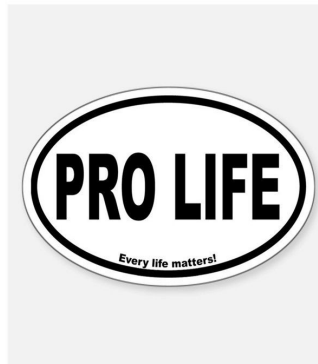

In case you missed it, at our October general meeting the Executive Board announced that our special activity for this year would be our 50/50 raffle. Our special activity proceeds are given to the Knights of Rosensteel Council to support the Council and its activities.

**Kudos:** October's charity focus was on the Boxes of Joy program run by Cross Catholic Outreach. The program provides Christmas boxes to children in underdeveloped countries who might otherwise not receive a gift. Many, many thanks to Carol Walper for coordinating the collection and to all who gave. I don't have the total on the number of boxes provided, but I am sure it will be generous. More details at our November meeting.

Our November charity focus is Shepherd's Table. Helen Vallone will be collecting items at the Council outside at the front of the building on Friday, November 5, from 5 to 8 p.m. and on Saturday, November 6, from 10:30 to 11:30 a.m. You may also purchase items from the Shepherd's Table wish list on Amazon; just let Helen know what you purchased. It needs paper products (napkins, three-compartment plates, empty brown lunch bags, spoons and forks, Ziploc sandwich bags), food items (coffee, creamer powder, sugar, sugar substitutes, salad dressing, vinegar, hot sauce, broth, syrup), toiletries (shampoo, conditioners, deodorant, ponchos, umbrellas), administrative items (stamps and 97 bright white paper) and clothing (jackets, sweaters, t-shirts, gloves, scarves, socks).

And for our December collection, we are once again supporting the Apostleship of the Sea, whose mission is to offer a welcome and safe haven to mariners, fishermen and their families. With the pandemic forcing seafarers to work and live on ships for months on end with cautions to not go on land, the Apostleship of the Sea ministry has become more vital than ever. Let's start saving, collecting or buying items, including 2022 calendars, paperback books, writing materials (pens, pencils, notebooks), toiletries, including razors, candy and snacks, socks, gloves and hats, puzzle books like Sudoku, crosswords, etc., playing cards or other small games.
