



A MESSAGE FROM OUR CHAPLAIN, REVEREND MARTIN VALLELY

Dear Brothers,

Well, October certainly did not turn out as I had expected it would. But God continues to walk with us on our journey through life. I

want to thank you all very much for your thoughtful and compassionate expressions of condolences upon the October 14th death of my brother, Deacon John Vallely of the Diocese of London. The Mass & Prayer Remembrance from the Sisters of the Precious Blood is particularly appreciated, as are individual condolences, and the visit to London of four Brother Knights who came to pay their respects throughout the day of visitation. I speak on behalf of my family as well, in offering this appreciation. Your thoughtfulness and support has helped to make the sorrow of these days much easier to bear. My brother was a man of deep faith, commitment, and service throughout his life. I know that he will intercede for us all from his place before God's throne.

I write these words of gratitude to you just as the Church is beginning November with days of great importance to us. As I wrote to you this time last year, "November begins with two of the most special feasts we have in the Catholic Church, All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day. These great

festivals proclaim our solemn belief in what is called the 'Communion of Saints', that spiritual unity which exists among all Christ's faithful people, living and deceased. On account of that unity, we are able to be of immeasurable assistance to those souls who have gone before us in death (praying for the dead, that they may be set free from Purgatory, is one of the most deeply ingrained of Catholic practices).

"And likewise, those saints who have been raised to glory in heaven are an immeasurable help to us here below, offering us example, encouragement, and blessing from the treasury of Christ's redeeming grace. The great throng of saints in heaven includes people from every imaginable background and walk in life. Some of them were real 'somebodies' in the world; others quite the opposite. Some lived a pure and spiritual life from their very beginnings on this earth; others were great sinners, or just unbelievers, whose lives were turned around by God's grace, often through the way God used other persons or events to bring them around to him.

"Every story is a human story, another story of God making his way into this world, just like he did in Jesus Christ. To be a saint is to recognize this movement of God in one's own life, and to 'give him permission'. It's straightforward enough, but often quite tough to actually do. It's why we need to be praying constantly, and supporting one another. A saint, as they often define it, is a struggling sinner. Moreover, as many a Pope has reminded us, the Church is ultimately saved and set on the right path, not by its official leaders or its great intellectuals, but by its saints."

I do not think I can improve on what I said in those remarks a year ago. In keeping with our theme series this year of noting saints who have a particular resonance for the spiritual lives of men, I want to take note now of Saint Stephen. We honour him on the day after Christmas, as many know. The Acts of the Apostles tells us that he was a fearless defender of the truth of Jesus Christ against early opposition to the Church's message. He did not hesitate to speak the truth, even though

it produced fierce negative reaction, and led to his death by stoning. Stephen is traditionally honoured as the

Church's very first adult Martyr. His dying words, borrowing from the Psalm, were "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit".

But I particularly want to highlight Stephen because he was one of the seven "devout men of good repute" who were chosen by the Apostles to be ordained the very first Deacons in the Church. Their principal role was to take care of the needs of those who would otherwise risk being neglected and ignored in the community. My brother John chose to enter the Permanent Diaconate, when it was still in its infancy in London (and in Hamilton, for that matter). It was the crown of his life's commitment, as he saw it. And he gave himself to it wholeheartedly, especially in caring for his brother Deacons as their Director, and in working very hard to develop the best possible formation program for those seeking to serve the Lord and his Church in this way. Saint Stephen, Saint Lawrence, Saint Francis of Assisi, and other Deacons in the Church's history, were great models and examples for my brother's life and service; and they constantly remind all of us to

develop our spiritual lives with humility, total dedication, and a yearning to serve the lowest and the least.

Please continue to keep Deacon John in your prayers, as well as myself and my family. And thank you again for your support and your love.

October 7-Flag Raising and Blessing

One of the biggest events of our council's history took place in October which fittingly is the month of Our Lady of the Most Holy Rosary. On October 7th, we took part in the blessing and raising of our new parish flags and flag poles. The flags and poles were made possible by a joint effort from our Fourth Degree Pope John Paul II Assembly, our parish and of course our council as well as Council Members. A special thanks also goes to our own Financial Secretary Vic Lefebvre. Vic conceived the idea back in the spring when he realized that since this is a special year for our country the Fourth Degree Assembly should do something patriotic as they are the most obviously patriotic segment of the Knights. He presented them with a plan that covered all of the Catholic churches in Burlington and funding was quickly approved by the Assembly members although not necessarily for flags and poles. Our council and the parish then agreed to supplement the funding so that both a Canadian Flag and a Papal flag could be erected at Holy Rosary.

Our Member of Parliament and Minister of Democratic Institutions Karina Gould was not only on hand to help celebrate the occasion, her office donated the Canadian flag and other 150th birthday memorabilia. The Fourth Degree was out in large numbers and this included Assembly members from Burlington, Hamilton and Oakville...a special thanks to Commander David Fisher for being there. David is also the Grand Knight of Mary Mother of God Council 14446 in Oakville. Our Chaplain and Pastor Father Martin blessed the flags immediately following the 5 PM Mass that afternoon. Halton Alive Euthanasia Symposium



Glasses for Haiti

Earlier this year Brother Blair Breckenridge responded to a need expressed by Brother Joe Baumgartner and his wife Joanna for used eye glasses to go to Haiti. An initiative was created whereby a box was made available at the back of the church for people to place their gently used and no longer required eye glasses. The response has been overwhelming as well as heart-warming because in total well over 500 pairs of very useable eye glasses of all descriptions, prescriptions and sizes are available to help the people of Haiti.

Approximately 200 pairs of glasses have already been delivered by Joanna to the poor and needy in Haiti. An additional 344 pairs were sorted and cleaned by members of our council during the weekend of October 21st and 22nd. These glasses will now be checked over one more time under the watchful eye of Brother Blair and they will soon be available for Haiti. Thank you to all of the parishioners who donated the glasses and to the efforts of our Knights to complete this excellent project.




Brothers help out at Holy Rosary School
