A MESSAGE FROM OUR CHAPLAIN, REVEREND MARTIN VALLELY

Dear Brothers,

It is hard to believe that we are already November, as our busy year marches on.

November begins

with two of the most special feasts we have in the Catholic Church, All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day. These great festivals proclaim our solemn belief in what is called the "Communion of Saints", that spiritual unity which exists among all Christ's faithful people, living and deceased. On account of that unity, we are able to be of immeasurable assistance to those souls who have gone before us in death (praying for the dead, that they may be set free from Purgatory, is one of the most deeply ingrained of Catholic practices).

And likewise, those saints who have been raised to glory in heaven are an immeasurable help to us here below, offering us example, encouragement, and blessing from the treasury of Christ's redeeming grace. The great throng of saints in heaven includes people from every imaginable background and walk in life. Some of them were real "somebodies" in the world; others quite the opposite. Some lived a pure and spiritual life from their very beginnings on this earth; others were great sinners, or just unbelievers, I also believe that honouring All Saints' Day and All whose lives were turned around by God's grace, Souls' Day is yet one more way of proclaiming our

often through the way God used other persons or events to bring them around to him.

Every story is a human story, another story of God at the point of making his way into this world, just like he did in Jesus Christ. To be a saint is to recognize this movement of God in one's own life, and to "give him permission". It's straightforward enough, but often quite tough to actually do. It's why we need to be praying constantly, and supporting one another. A saint, as they often define it, is a struggling sinner. Moreover, as many a Pope has reminded us, the Church is ultimately saved and set on the right path, not by its official leaders or its great intellectuals, but by its saints.

> Among the many gifts which the Knights are to the Church, and to me personally, I especially appreciate that you are guys who keep on trying, keep on seeking to be the best you can be, and to give in every way you can. You are all busy and active in your personal and family lives. You know you have struggles and failures along the way. But you truly want to do the right thing. I think that is as good a definition of a saint-in-the-making as we need. If we do not forget to start with ourselves, God will use us as he sees fit to help change others, even when we do not know it is happening. His face will be shown to the world through us. I firmly believe it.

conviction that all human life is to be regarded as sacred, to be protected, safeguarded, and defended. This is because we believe that each one of us, especially the most vulnerable and neglected, is called to be an icon, an image, of God himself, bearing the stamp of the redeemed humanity which is the legacy of Christ's coming among us and giving himself for us. If we are all called to be saints, then we must have an awful lot going for us! Not on our own, but because of God's love. We help each other on that journey, and that starts with respect for the dignity of each person, for each one among us is called to be a saint!!

From its very foundation, the Knights of Columbus has been a staunch supporter of care for those who would otherwise be most neglected. outgrowth of this in modern times has been the Knights' fervent action on behalf of the unborn. In the name of the whole church and all those voiceless ones to whom you give a voice, I thank you for your advocacy of life, and your relentless and unflagging fight against abortion, euthanasia, and all other attacks on the dignity of human life. Just as one example, your generous support of the work of Special Olympics is a way of proclaiming your vision of the importance and dignity, and potential for greatness, of every human life.....not just the privileged or "fortunate" human life, but every human life. So, by this, you are supporting "saints-in-the-making". And they will support you, believe me.






DONATION TO BURLINGTON FOOD BANK – Partnership West




COUNCIL MEMBERSHIP DRIVE


KOFC ANNUAL TURKEY ROLL – December 2






Cob's Bakery
