November is, of course, the last month of the liturgical year. The Church year's ending a month earlier than the secular year gives a good reminder to us to accomplish the things we had intended to accomplish by the end of the year. The liturgical cycle's ultimate Sunday is that of Christ the King. The solemnity reminds us that the kingdom of God will be brought to its fullness one day, at the end of time as we know it. As does every solemnity of the Lord, Christ the King Sunday helps us to focus on and understand the identity of Christ and his place in our lives.

As we think about end times, November also focuses our attention on the deceased. The month begins with the Solemnity of All Saints. All Souls' Day then reminds us to pray for all the faithful departed who are not officially recognized as saints. Here in the parish, we will celebrate the customary Mass of the faithful departed in the parish cemetery.

The gospel reading for the Feast of All Saints includes the Beatitudes as St. Matthew recorded them. That same gospel is an optional gospel reading for All Souls' Day. To prepare ourselves to think about the end times and our desire for a happy death, we turn our mind to what happiness really means. Jesus reminds us that those who mourn will be comforted. Comfort has more to do with strengthening than with pleasure. When we pray for others, especially in the context of the Mass, we will receive the strength we need to prepare for the end times, whenever our own end might come.

Church: November 2nd All Souls Mass will be at the Catholic Cemetery at 12:05. November 26th Corporate Communion Mass will be at 5:00 Mass. Please remember to wear your green shirt.

Council: Deceased Members mass will be November 11th at 6:30. We will have our flag retirement ceremony following the mass. **Pro Life**: During our 40 days of life 260 moms have chosen not to have an abortion. We continue to pray at every meeting during our 40 days of life.

Family: We will need a new Family Director.

Youth: Creative Contraption and Chris Columbus Poster Contest was a success.

BINGO: Remember we always need help on Wednesday night. We gave out \$16,730 in prizes this month. We made a profit of \$10,000 this month.

4th Degree: Flag retirement ceremony, November 11th.

Deputy Grand Knight: Don't forget to give me an Activity Report for any event that Knights participate in. The form can be found on our web page or just ask me for one. This is what we use to track our volunteer hours and we use them for our end of the year write ups.

Good of the Order: Approved motion to make Council 802 a Home Corporation passed. Also passed motion to allow GK to be the signatory for the council. Approved \$175 for new software for our newsletter. Report on Coats for Kids program. We will be presenting all coats to the Boys and Girls Club on December 8th. Approved \$250 to purchase a prison ministry gift bag. Motion for \$16,000 to remodel meeting room and bar was tabled to Trustee's for review.
