

### Special from John Maloney. **BGK**



When the KC Hall was built it didn't have air conditioning. There were and still are, two exhaust fans at the far end of the hall behind the facade. In 1962 or 1963 a used, large, air conditioning unit was purchased from a theater in Tupelo. Andy Stockton, Harry Routt and Nelson Walker went to Tupelo and got the unit. With much trouble it was installed at the outside back wall of the building. A metal structure was built around it for protection. When the current air conditioning units were purchased, the old one was dismantled and the metal structure is now used for storage.

Another addition to the building was a storage room off the kitchen. A member named Ralph Walters (a contractor) built the storage room. Later the roof leaked and the walls started to rot near the floor, so it was completely torn down and rebuilt as it is today with the offices/bingo room.

Over the years other improvements were made such as; new air conditioners, new wiring, new security coverage, bingo equipment, new tables and chairs, new lights and most recently a new sound system.

The 40 Days for Life campaign held from September 23rd through November 1st has received many blessings. As I write this article, the Monday update report came in. Local leaders are now reporting 412 babies were saved from abortion (that we know of). There are surely many more mothers that chose LIFE as a direct result of our prayers. You offer up your prayers to the Lord ... and He responds with love and mercy. Thank all of you that read and prayed our daily devotionals.

A Virginia community gathered this past week to celebrate. For some people, it might have been easy to think that an abortion facility that had been open for 27 years would never go out of business. Thank God, the local 40 Days for Life leaders in Manassas, Virginia did not ascribe to that mentality. Instead, they directed campaign after campaign in front of a place that many thought was there to stay. They believed in the power of prayer, and they saw those prayers answered when the abortion facility where they had prayed – a business that had taken thousands of lives over those 27 years – closed its doors. It happened there ... and in 63 other locations where 40 Days for Life vigils have been held. PRAISE GOD!

Our prayer vigils do more than send a message of love for the unborn and hope for the mothers. Through the grace of Christ, we testify that everyone – the children in the womb, the mothers who carry them, the boyfriends who come to the clinic, the Planned Parenthood workers, and the drivers who honk and wave – are all created in God's image, and their lives have meaning and purpose.

While we often highlight "abortion" when we think of pro-life, it has a much deeper meaning. Last month Father Frank wrote in our newsletter the following article (in part). This bears the opportunity to be read again. Our vision for Pro-Life...

October is Respect Life Month in the U. S. Thanks for your untiring efforts to support the dignity of the life of every human being from conception to natural death. It's good to remind ourselves that being pro-life is much more than being against abortion. Being pro-life means that we respect the dignity of the unborn, the handicapped, the elderly, the dying, victims of sex-trafficking, the prisoner (even those on death row), refugees, migrants, and anyone whose life or dignity is under threat.

But the unborn are among the most vulnerable. But let us not forget the guilt and shame which those involved in abortion carry within themselves. That includes men as well as women. As Knights and good Catholics please continue to reach out to them and encourage them to come to the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
