#### **Family of the Month**


#### **Bob & Janet Brandt**

ould you like the secrets for unparalleled success and unshakable happiness? Steven Scott delivers in this book, as he relates how we can use the teachings of Jesus in our every day lives.

Scott believes that there are essentially seven communication techniques that can turn a poor communicator into a great one. He explains how you can learn to achieve a greater level of creativity and productivity, which will enhance your value in any career. And, he shows you how to apply these principals in your personal relationships to achieve greater levels of communication where it really counts; in your home with your loved ones.

One thing we can always improve upon, is our communication. Recognizing the manner and methods that we use to reach out to others are as important as our message is instrumental to achieving better communication and is a highlight of this book.

This book is very effective in reminding us what is really important and takes the lessons left to us by Jesus, to clearly show how to apply them. Scott provides stories from his own life experiences as practical examples of how he has used the Bible and the missions that Jesus accomplished during his lifetime, to become successful in his business and personal relationships.

# A message from our **State Youth Director** on **Catholic Tuition Support**

As we enter the final months of 2009, please consider the Catholic Tuition Organization of the Diocese of Phoenix (CTODP) or the Tuition Support Organization (CTSO through the Diocese of Tucson.

The State of Arizona has provided taxpayers an education tax credit since 1998. This means that when you send a contribution of \$1,000 if filing jointly or up to \$500 if filing singly, the State will provide you a dollar-for-dollar-tax credit. This is a wonderful way for individuals to provide tuition assistance for students in Catholic schools at no additional cost to them. If you chose not to participate in either of these programs, the State will control those same tax dollars instead of you directing the dollars to a Catholic School.

The CTODP and the CTSO supports the mission of Catholic schools – "FAITH IN EDUCATION...shaping mind, body and spirit." I encourage all of our brother Knights to also support this mission.

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## "I already have insurance at work."
