Our Membership Training meetings have been completed in all five of the dioceses and I am very pleased with the turnout and participation of the Membership Chairmen, Retention Chairmen, Grand Knights, and Council Officers who attended. I hope that the information presented will assist you in recruiting new members and retaining our existing members.

The Supreme Council has started the Delta Church Drive which was discussed at these meetings. Hopefully your council has ordered the kits and set up a drive at your parish and have your Pastor on board. This is the new and improved way to hold a church drive. Information can be found on the state website if you did not attend the membership meetings.

At the meetings we asked that each member bring in one new member and we could grow our order. As of today, we have 248 councils that have not brought in one new member. We have over 60,000 members in NJ.

Will your council be able to survive the future if there is no one there to run the programs and council?

As of October 15^{th,} we have brought in just over 300 new members with that being 18% of the goal needed for the year.

Is your council/district striving to win the financial incentive for the half of the fraternal year. We will award this in January once all the numbers are in. It is not too late. With 248 councils not reporting a new member everyone still has a chance.

That is a challenge to the District Deputies to work with the Grand Knights and recruit new members to our Order. If any member of the Membership team can ever be of service to you or your council, please feel free to contact us.


New magnets have been ordered and are expected to be delivered shortly. The new magnets have a small change and will read: "Shoulder to Shoulder with our Officers in Blue".

FREE THROW TOURNAMENT PATRIOTIC CORNER

Brothers.

With Thanksgiving this month and Christmas next month, that means it is getting to be time for indoor activities for the children. This is a great time to start planning your Council's Free Throw Tournament, which will take place in January. With School and Township Tournaments under way, it might be wise to reserve a gym now, don't wait until January.

The Tournament is open to boys and girls age 9 – 14. The child's age is determined by the age they are on January 1, 2020. Children under 9 or older than 14 on that date may not compete in the "Official Tournament", but that doesn't mean you can't hold a Council Tournament for the younger children, or a 3 pt competition for the older children

Free Throw Tournament kits can be ordered from Supreme or if you have forms left over from previous years, you may use them.

Competitors $\underline{\text{MUST}}$ be accompanied by a parent or guardian and $\underline{\text{MUST}}$ bring a copy of their birth certificate to $\underline{\text{every}}$ round of the Tournament they compete in.

After the Council competition is completed in January, your District Deputy will hold a round in February and the winners of the District Round will advance to the Diocesan Round on March 15. The Diocesan winners will compete in the State Finals, scheduled for March 29. Letters will be provided informing the Diocesan Champions of the location and time schedule for the State Finals.

In the past few years, we have had some of our State Champions go on to win the International competition and we hope to be fortunate again.

Why We Do What We Do

There are three components of Charitable Giving: Time, Talent and Treasure. Sure, it is easy to just write a check for a worthy cause and go back to watching your favorite show, but is it as rewarding?

I am not talking about financial rewards. I am referring to the joy and satisfaction that warms your entire being that you receive from volunteering and knowing that your Time and Talent has helped and often times changed lives.

A simple "Thank You" from the Chairman or the Grand Knight is a welcome gesture, but recognition from your fellow Council members or the State or Supreme Council is even more gratifying.

It begins with Councils determining which, or the hundreds of potential programs recommended by the State or Supreme Council is best suited to a local Council's membership.

To do this, the first step is to refer to the Grand Knight Handbook, which is available on-line at www.njkofc.org. We have made this Handbook "visible" to anyone with a level 1 authorization, or better.

After programs are selected, and executed, the final State and Supreme Reporting Forms are all available on the State and Supreme websites. A few key strokes, click "submit", and you're done.

So why report? Very simply, it is a public recognition of your member's time and sweat equity AND it often inspires other Councils to realize, "We can do that!"

All reporting forms are important, but if I had to select one that is vital, it would be the Annual Survey of Fraternal Activities (Form #1728) which is due by January 31st each year. This form is available at: https://www.kofc.org/un/en/forms/spa/invite.html?lang=e n&form=1728C.01 and completion of which helps the Knights of Columbus to maintain its tax exempt status with the Internal Revenue Service.

Also available at this site is the Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity Individual Member Worksheet (Form #1728A) located at:

http://kofc.org/un/en/forms/council/individual_survey1728a_p.pdf

Members should avail this form and refer to iteach time an activity is completed. Completed forms should be submitted to your Grand Knight at the end of each calendar year.
