## **Public Witness**

October is National Right to Life Month throughout the United States. The first Sunday of October is "Right to Life Sunday", this year October 5.

For over forty years, Christians have rallied along many roadsides with signs that say "Abortion is Murder", Pray for our Nation" and similar phrases. The rallies are well received by the public with a lot of "thumbs up" from mature adults and a few unpleasant remarks from the immature.

This years "Life Chain" rally will be held in New Lenox with people lining US 30 on both sides from Cedar Road westward. As usual, Joe Sluis will provide about 125 signs for use by the demonstrators.

The rally is from 2:30 PM until 3:30 PM. Park in the Harris Bank parking lot on the west side of the bank that is located on the corner of Cedar Rd. and US 30. Signs will be available at about 2:00 PM and will be collected after the event for next year.

Attendees at the rally come from various local churches. Some families bring their children along to hold more signs. The signs are not offensive and bring a great message to the world that abortion is wrong!

The ramp was installed in her home's garage for a woman who could not bring her badly injured husband home from the hospital without having the ramp. Grand Knight Rich Ciancio agreed that the council will pay for materials, which cost \$97.54

Brother Joe Kral donated five really nice aluminum hinged sills for the bottom edges of ramps, one of which finished this one very nicely. Four of the sills are still available for the future.

## Teens 4 Life

One of the greatest events sponsored by the Knights of Columbus each year is the March for Life in Washington DC. The March is usually attended by about half a million Christians, mostly Catholic. More than half are young people. The Marches for Life are the largest civil rights demonstrations in history.

St Mary Church Youth Ministry has started a group called "Teens 4 Life" that will encourage our high school and college age youngsters to attend the March in 2015. This wonderful ministry needs our support. It costs \$340 per teen and \$435 per adult to go on the March with our diocesan buses The parents of teenagers usually need financial help to send their teens.

The March is a wonderful and inspiring spiritual encounter. You should go if you can, but if you can't, write a generous check to the St Mary Youth Ministry and place it in an envelope in the collection basket. Your check will be earmarked for the Youth Ministry but will count as a contribution to the Church
