Cliff's K of C Food Report For The Month Of October

Let me start by saying thank to all the knights who step up and help with the many food events our council sponsors. We cannot continue to offer to be involved with these events without your continued support. These meals we provide are just one aspect of the many charitable activities our council provides for our church and community. Again thank you for your support! Listed below are the upcoming events that we need your help with.

On Monday, October 23rd is St. James Council 1728 regular scheduled monthly meeting for the month of October. The April bingo crew is scheduled to prepare and serve the steak dinner before our meeting. There are 3 boxes of steaks in the chest freezer in the basement. About 30 steaks need to be thawed out and seasoned on Sunday. One tray of potatoes (about 35) need to be washed and put in the convection oven at 5:00 PM on Monday. A tossed salad and garlic bread also need to be prepared before serving the meal at 6:00 PM. The bingo chairman is responsible to notify his crew to accomplish this task.

On Wednesday, October 25th is our council's turn to feed super to the 40 to50 kids at the Newman Center. The meal is served at 5:30 PM at the Newman Center. The meal needs to be prepared at the hall or at someone's home and transported to the Newman Center. Usually the meal consists of a main course, a salad or vegetable and a dessert. Last month Prince Of Peace council provided a smoked pork tenderloin meal. The meal can be anything we choose to provide. Table service and drinks are provided by the Newman Center. Any leftovers we have can stay at the Newman Center if we so choose. The Newman Center kitchen is very small so I need 2 or 3 knights to provide and serve this meal.

On Saturday, October 28th St. James Council 1728 is scheduled to provide the noon meal for the Habitat for Humanity's 50 workers. The meal needs to be prepared and transported to the work site at the Marlatt Addition on 17th St and Ave M and served at noon. In case of bad weather the meal will be served at the Habitat for Humanity building located at 1815 1st Ave. Table service and drinks are provided by Habitat for Humanity. The meal can be anything we want to make. I need 2 or 3 knights to provide and serve this meal.

On Sunday, October 29th is our 5th Sunday breakfast at St. James church parish hall. A full breakfast will be served starting at 8:00 AM and ending at noon. Preparations for this meal need to start at 6:00 AM. A free will offering will be taken at the door. I need a knight to lead and organize this event and all the knights to volunteer to help prepare and serve this meal.

On Saturday, November 4th is our 4th degree Fall Harvest Breakfast. This is our only fund raiser for the 4th degree all year. This event has been very successful in the past, but it cannot be done without your help. All of you have tickets to pre-sell and are asked to help with the preparation and serving of the breakfast. We will serve breakfast starting at 7:00 AM and serve till 11:00 AM at the Old Town Hall downtown. I need a knight to lead and organize this event and all the 4th degree knights to help prepare and serve this meal.

I usually lead and organize all these events but I will be out of town the week of all these events. The council needs their members to step up and take on these events. I will assist as much as I can before I leave for the week. Contact me at 308-293-0795.

Why 'Francis'?

By choosing the name Francis, the Argentine Jesuit who will lead the world's 1.2 billion Roman Catholics, has signaled a devotion to simple living and social justice, analysts say.

No Pope has ever chosen to be called Francis before, and it was not among the names favored by odds makers betting on which the new pontiff would choose. The name harks back to St. Francis of Assisi, who founded the Franciscan order.

Picking a name is the first decision made by the new pontiff and a closely watched sign of how he will lead the church.

Popes were once known by their first names; the first Pope who changed his name was John II (533-535), who shed the name Mercurious because of its pagan roots. The practice did not become common until centuries later.

Benedict XVI, 85, whose resignation led to Francis' election, said he took the name to link himself to Benedict XV, "who guided the church through the turbulent times of the First World War."

So what meaning might be taken by Jorge Bergoglio's selection of Francis?

The Catholic Encyclopedia writes that St. Francis of Assisi is a beloved figure even among those "who care little about the order he founded.... This unique position Francis owes no small measure to his singularly lovable and winsome personality."

The Saint renounced worldly goods and lived in poverty.

That spirit seems to suit the new Pope: As a Cardinal in Argentina, Pope Francis was known for his personal austerity, eschewing the church mansion and taking public transportation around Buenos Aires, according to the Associated Press.
