Thought for October

Some people don't much enjoy going to mass. They go because the Church requires them to go or their family asks them to accompany them. But given the choice they would stay home. They say the mass is the "same old thing" and the sermons are terrible. Why go?

Let's compare the Mass to say, living at home. Your home requires continual cleaning and maintenance. That's also the "same old thing". You do the same cleaning tasks such as dishes every day and dusting every week or so. Without that "same old thing" your home would soon become an unlivable mess. And eating at home fixing meals is also the "same old thing" but you need food.

The mass is a gift of God that helps you to put your soul in order, to maintain and to strengthen your soul. Otherwise it would become a dirty mess like an unkempt home. The readings help you understand and live your life better. And Communion feeds and strengthens you if you are not in mortal sin. As with the house, your spirit, your soul requires care and nourishment. So try to understand the Mass better. Study or ask or talk with people about it. And realize it is not the "same old thing" but a gift from God and a way to come closer to Him.
