Grand Knight's Letter

Brothers,

Let me start off this month's letter with my sincere thanks for all the hard work that you have put in during this past month. We have done a great deal for the parish, and it could not have been done without your continued support. I have heard nothing but good things about the Parish Picnic, and the Knights once again played a pivotal role in ensuring that everyone was properly fed. I want to give special thanks to Tim Speidel and Bill McMenamin for their work in getting all of the grills to and from St. Andrew's. It's a lot of work before and after the picnic to move those grills around, and they made it much easier to coordinate with their flatbed trailer.

We have several degrees being held in our district and our area in this month, including a Fourth Degree exemplification in Fairfax. It doesn't come any closer than that to us. If you're not a Third Degree Knight, now is a perfect opportunity to become one. Speak with me or the Worthy Chancellor, and we'll help you on your way through the degrees along the journey to full Knighthood.

One piece of new business which came up at our last meeting was in regard to the purchasing of name badges for newly initiated Brother Knights. The Worthy Warden can point to several badges which currently languish in our cabinets for those who attended the First Degree but haven't made it to a regular business meeting.

While our hope is always that we regularly see all of our Brother Knights, we understand that for some people, our meeting time is not practical due to other commitments. But that still leaves us with a lot of badges. To that end, the Worthy Warden looked to what was being done at our local Assembly to help solve that problem. There, a small deposit is collected to procure the badge. If the new Fourth Degree member attends a meeting shortly after initiation, the deposit is returned to the Sir Knight in the form of a free dinner at the meeting. If the Sir Knight doesn't make a meeting within two or three months, the money is used to mail the badge to

him.

Adapting this process seemed like a good idea, and a motion was made as a standing resolution at the last meeting for consideration at future meetings. That motion reads as follows:

"I move that we require a \$10 deposit to be collected for badges for new First Degree members. If the badge is collected within 60 days of its arrival, the deposit will be returned; otherwise, it will be used to mail the badge to the new Knight's address. The Grand Knight may choose to waive this deposit at his discretion in the event of financial hardship or other extenuating circumstances."

This motion will be voted upon at a future meeting. If you have any comments on it, please come to the next Council meetings or send them to me via e-mail at james.auwaerter@gmail.com.

Grand Knight's Reflection

On September 11, we received permission from the bishops to have a special set of readings in commemoration of the terror attacks of September 11, 2001. I read through the regular set of readings for that Sunday before Mass that day, and I thought that they deserved to be reflected upon.

In the first reading from the Book of Sirach, one of the Books of Wisdom, we are told that "Wrath and anger are hateful things, but the sinner hugs them tight." The idea of hugging or embracing anger is an unusual turn-ofphrase, and it raises a couple of interesting points to think about.

For example, it's much more common to hear "I am angry" than "I am embracing anger". The first sentence is passive, a statement of being. It sometimes continues with a justification for the anger: "I am angry because...". The second sentence is active. The person has made the choice to embrace anger. Can you imagine saying "I am embracing anger because...", and feeling justified in that anger?

For another point, a hug is not something that can be done casually. In the same way that a person could not hug two people at once, that person cannot embrace both anger and love. The anger hugs the sinner back, making it that much harder to remember how we should love one another and love God our creator.

At the end of the First Reading, we are told "Think of the commandments, hate not your neighbor..." Jesus asks us to go beyond simply not hating our neighbor, but to love him as ourselves. That is given as one of the two greatest commandments in the Bible. In the Gospel, Peter asks about the limits of that love. When he suggested forgiving someone seven times for a sin, he was being generous according to the customs of that time, but Jesus went even further. Seventy-seven times forgiven is a number that cannot truly be counted. Could you forgive someone and mark a tally until the time that forgiveness ends, and truly claim that you were forgiving that person in the first place? Our compassion should not be treated as something that is owed to others for a time, but a gift that we extend to others just as it is extended to us by God.
