#### CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE

Years ago, a young man was studying for the priesthood at St. Mary of the Lake Seminary in Chicago. A year before ordination he contracted a fatal disease. Shortly before his death he wrote to a friend: "Every so often we have showdowns in our lives by which we are challenged...to grow in our faith or to lose it. I feel that this experience is that kind of challenge. If we really are the Christians we claim to be, we have to believe that every part of our lives has value, including an illness like this."

That young man was living by faith. He was doing what Jesus said to do. He was picking up his cross and carrying it. He was saying, "God knows best; he always has his reasons."

Suffering and sorrow are like birth and death. They are a part of life. No matter who we are or where we go we cannot escape them.

But suffering and sorrow are not what is important. What is important is how we respond to them. How we accept them. How we use them.

In Romans, Paul tells us: "We know all things work for good for those who love God." And again he writes: "Rejoice in hope, endure in affliction, persevere in prayer...do not be conquered by evil but conquer evil with good." Finally he writes, "The sufferings of this present time are nothing as compared with glory to be revealed for us."
