Beginning with a hot buffet breakfast, the intrepid 42 golfers sped off in their carts to begin the shotgun start. With a record number of hole sponsors and the camaraderie of the Closter Council, we finished about 1PM, just in time to head back to the Council Hall for a buffet lunch donated by the Recovery Room.

Following the luncheon, the door prize raffle was held with gift provided by merchants from Westwood, Woodcliff Lake, Emerson, and Park Ridge. Cash prizes were awarded for the longest drive, straightest drive, lowest foursome score, and four closest to the pin contests. A separate raffle for prizes was held and netted \$665.00 of which we received 82.3% - the rest going to the Closter Council. With all the expenses paid except for the placemats, the outing will net about \$5600.00. Of this amount, \$4000.00 will go to the Scholarship Fund for three and the rest will fund our general charity account to be used for our various donations.
