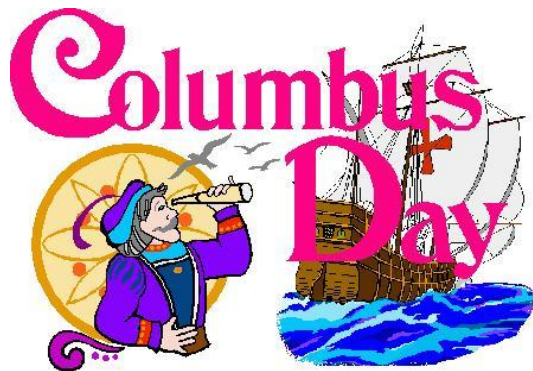



in the 1st century. The visible wounds on the linen are consistent with the Gospel accounts and forensic science confirms that the blood stains are real human blood from a man who had suffered a great loss of blood and was then laid in this linen after he had died (this can be explained in the presentation). In the past 120 years, over 1000 research articles have been published on the Shroud.

After seeing the facts, you can come to your own reasoned judgment regarding the question of authenticity. If one pursues a personal study of the Shroud this can be a life-changing event, to the degree that we allow it to be. If it is the burial cloth of Jesus, then it is a precious relic. If it is not then it is an icon. Either way, it is a “sacramental”. In fact, *the Shroud replica you will see has been blessed.*

The point of the presentation is not to win a debate. But rather, to answer the question, ‘how can I use the Shroud to deepen my relationship with Jesus?’ The reality of the Shroud points us toward the reality of Jesus, truly present in the Blessed Sacrament - a **harmony between our faith and our reason.**
