Chaplain's Reflection Forgiveness - the Cornerstone of Christianity

Christianity has deeply and profoundly influenced Western culture in ways we often don't realize. So we take for granted certain values like forgiveness of enemies that are not natural in the human arena. In ancient Greece and Rome, forgiveness of one's enemies was clearly not a high value. Yet, we find this revolutionary idea in the teaching of Jesus and our Church, even if many Christians do not exemplify it. So a major turn when it came to forgiveness occurred with the Incarnation of Christ.

Christianity has a very unique view of forgiveness. Forgiveness is a set of practices, not an emotion. Forgiveness is something we do. Forgiveness of enemies is one of the practices distinctive to Christianity. It's not fundamentally about your beliefs or your feelings, it's a way to live.

Forgiveness is always a form of voluntary suffering that brings about a greater good. Whenever you are wronged the perpetrator owes you. He or she has wrongfully robbed you of some good, whether of reputation or relationship or health or of something else. To forgive is to deny oneself revenge. Forgiveness is always costly to the forgiver. However, the peace that forgiveness brings to your own heart, and the possibility of a restored relationship, outweigh the cost.

Forgiveness means that we take the initiative even though we are the ones who were offended. Like Jesus, we are going down the path that the person who offended us should have taken. We are going to seek reconciliation. Costly, of course. Think of the pride you have to swallow. Think of your sense of being a victim that you have to overcome. Sure, you are a victim, but you're not going to claim it as a badge of honor. In fact, you're going to overcome that. That costs.

Why do we say that God's forgiveness of the world happened through the Cross of Jesus? Why couldn't God just come and forgive us without the


Cross? Well, it's because forgiveness, if it's real forgiveness, always costs the one who does the forgiving. Jesus paid that price on the Cross. There's a redemption involved. What we see iconically on the Cross is the manifestation of the cost that God paid in forgiving us. God made a journey into our dysfunction. So as Christian disciples, we have to be willing to make that same journey into the dysfunction of others, for the sake of the world.

The practice of Christianity is for the sake of the world. We are the salt of the earth. We are not Christians for ourselves. We are Christians for the world because we have been chosen by Christ, baptized and confirmed and drawn into His mystical body that we might now become a light to the nations. Notice what happens when forgiveness fades away as a publicly lived reality. What takes its place is the fierce, honor driven, brittle hardedged, violent society we now have.

People forgive others when they know they've been forgiven. Hardly a day goes by that we are not offended by someone. Yet, if we block God out so that there's no one to forgive us, then we are going to become very harsh to those who are cruel to us. But if we have a deep sense that despite our having offended God over and over again, that we've still been forgiven, then we are going to be much more generous as we reach out to other people who've offended us. On the other hand, if we have no relationship with God or deny His existence, we will never feel forgiven.

Those who won't forgive show that they have not accepted the fact of their own sinfulness. But if we can say, "there, but for the grace of God go I," if we can recognize ourselves as a more wretched sinner than others, then forgiveness becomes easier. If we derive our self worth from God, it frees us up to forgive others. Then, and only then, do we belong to Christ.


