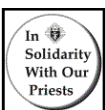


Dear Brother Knights,

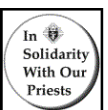
October is Respect Life Month in the U.S. Thanks for your untiring efforts to support the dignity of the life of every human being from conception to natural death. It's good to remind ourselves that being pro-life is much more than being against abortion. Being pro-life means that we respect the dignity of the unborn, the handicapped, the elderly, the dying, victims of sex-trafficking, the prisoner (even those on death row), refugees, migrants, and anyone whose life or dignity is under threat. But the unborn are among the most vulnerable.

But let us not forget the guilt and shame which those involved in abortion carry within themselves. That includes men as well as women. As Knights and good Catholics please continue to reach out to them and encourage them to come to the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Recently, Pope Francis gave all priests the power to forgive the sin of abortion. Previously, because the sin of abortion is so serious, a woman or man had to be absolved by a bishop. In order to make the mercy of God more accessible, Pope Francis now gives the faculty to all priests throughout the world. In the U.S. and some other countries the Bishop has already delegated this faculty to priests. In the Diocese of Jackson, priests have been able to forgive the sin of abortion for over 30 years. This is not true in every Diocese throughout the world. That is why Pope Francis is extending that faculty during the Year of Mercy which begins December 8, 2015. Again, if you know of anyone carrying the share of this sin, please encourage them to experience the mercy of God in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. And I know that you will continue praying the Rosary during October for the dignity of all human life.

This month's report is going to look like a book report and movie review, because I just finished a great book and watched a wonderful movie that I think all knights should read and see. First the book: Saint John Paul the Great: His Five Loves by Jason Evert. Discover the five greatest loves of Saint John Paul II, through remarkable unpublished stories about him from bishops, priests who organized his papal pilgrimages, his students in Poland, Swiss Guards, and others. The book is written in a fashion that makes it a very easy read. The first part is a bio on his early life until he became pope, but the second part of the book is why you should read it.

Saint John Paul the Great's five loves are young people, human love, the Holy Eucharist, the Blessed Virgin Mary and the Cross. I recommend this book to anyone who has ever wondered why the Catholic Church seems to have so much to say about marriage. Our culture is convinced that it is only about "two people who love each other" see what Saint John Paul said. Evert draws on the Saint's long experience in what we now call young adult ministry, in which he offered both teaching and counseling to couples through their engagement and marriage: not a single couple he guided ever suffered a divorce. I found that simply amazing! Rekindle your own faith by learning what captivated the heart of this great saint. Reading the chapter on the Holy Eucharist while attending Adoration was fantastic. Try it! Best part is you can get this book very cheap.

Second, the movie, War room. I went to see this movie not really knowing what it was about. What I found was an outstandingly produced movie with great actors. The movie is about a family that appears to have it all. But you quickly find out that looks are deceiving. Their whole life changes when they run into Miss Clara, who encourages the couple to find happiness through prayer. You have NEVER met a prayer warrior like Miss Clara. She will force you to rethink how you pray. I can't recommend this movie enough, especially if you want to improve your prayer life.

Finally, we still need a youth leader. So after you read the chapter on Young People and watch the movie about praying, hopefully you will find God guiding you to help out our youth. If you do please talk with me and we will work on getting you trained and ready for a great time!

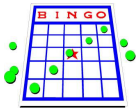

It was an incredible blessing for me to travel to Washington D.C. to attend the Canonization Mass for St. Junipero Serra on September 23, 2015. It was the first mass that Pope Francis had ever celebrated on US soil, and it was also the first canonization to be held in the United States.

About 50 seminarians and one priest from Notre Dame took a bus to DC for the event. It was a quick trip, but I was able to get a seat at the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception and Pope Francis processed up the middle aisle and blessed all of us in the Church before walking outside onto the grounds for the mass (we watched mass on large television screens and were able to receive communion).

When the Pope walked into the Church I felt like I was at an SEC football game. The crowd was mostly excited seminarians and religious sisters so I guess it wasn't surprising that it got a little rowdy! When the Pope reached the altar and turned around and gave us a blessing I was very moved and grateful to be able to see a man who has inspired me so much in my own vocation. What a great model of priesthood for me and for so many other seminarians who have been blessed to be in formation while Francis is Pope. Oct. 13 at 6:30 PM. ----- Columbus Day Mass and Potluck meal at the K of C Hall

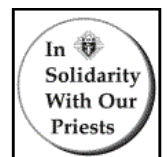
Oct. 31st at 6:30 PM ----- 5th Saturday Family Dinner and Halloween Party (combined) at the K of C hall.

By the time you receive this the 40 Days for Life campaign will be well underway. It is being held from September 23rd through November 1st. I ask all Fellow Knights to join thousands of Pro-Life participants in daily prayer during this campaign. The daily intentions and prayer are being posted on the Knights of Columbus Facebook page. Join together in saving the next life.

Meanwhile our House and Senate leaders began their plans on Thursday, September 24th, to avoid a politically risky shut-down next week, moving to separate an angry and bitter debate over abortion from a must-pass bill to keep government agencies open.

After Pope Francis addressed a joint meeting of Congress, Speaker John Boehner told his leadership team he would immediately put a plan to defund Planned Parenthood into legislative vehicle known on Capitol Hill as "reconciliation," which cannot be filibustered in the Senate.

The speaker's team argues that by putting the provision in a reconciliation bill, there's a good chance it will be approved in both chambers of Congress and it will force the President to use his veto pen. Progress is being made but much work lies ahead.

PLEASE PRAY THAT OUR CONGRESSIONAL LEADERS WILL SHUT OFF FUNDING TO PLANNED PARENTHOOD.

Speaking of Pope Francis, I hope all of you were able to listen to his address to Congress. While Pope Francis spoke on several topics, below are the comments made by Pope Francis concerning Pro-Life.

Defending Human Life

"The Golden Rule also reminds us of our responsibility to protect and defend human life at every stage of its development. This conviction has led me, from the beginning of my ministry, to advocate at different levels for the global abolition of the death penalty. I am convinced that this way is the best, since every life is sacred, every human person is endowed with an inalienable dignity, and society can only benefit from the rehabilitation of those convicted of crimes.

Recently my brother bishops here in the United States renewed their call for the abolition of the death penalty. Not only do I support them, but I also offer encouragement to all those who are convinced that a just and necessary punishment must never exclude the dimension of hope and the goal of rehabilitation."

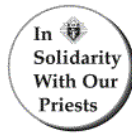
