





Chaplain Fr. Matthew Simmons



I am writing this reflection while it is the Feast of St. Linus, who was the first Pope after St. Peter. As was St. Peter and most of Peter's early successors, Linus was a martyr for the Christian faith. St. Paul mentions him at the end of Paul's Second Letter to Timothy. In the first reading for Mass today, St. Peter wrote in his first letter, "Feed the flock of God which is among you, taking care of it, not by constraint, but willingly, according to God: not for the sake of base gain, but voluntarily." While that command is incumbent on me as pastor of the parish, it also extends to parishioners and especially fathers.

In Judaism, fathers have the responsibility to teach the law to their children. That responsibility continued to be understood in early Christianity. Somewhere along the line, though, the feeling of responsibility seems to have diminished. Now religious instruction of children is not a priority for most. Among those who do make it a priority, there is often the expectation that the parish school of religion is the primary place of religious instruction. While PSR is important, the family is still the "domestic Church." Fathers have the privilege of giving instruction to their children and growing in relationship to both their children and their Father. As Knights, it is important that you encourage your sons and sons-in-law in this role. Your example is important as well. There are many good apps for phones that facilitate reading the Scriptures each day. I use the iBreviary app to read the Scriptures for daily Mass ahead of time. While that is the most popular app for priests, I think the Laudate app is the most popular Catholic app for the laity.

The final days of October include the feast of the English & Welsh martyrs of Douai. These martyrs were priests who, after the English reformation, were formed and ordained in France to return to England to lead those Catholics who remained faithful to the Church following the Reformation. The Douay-Rheims Bible was also prepared at the English College in Douai. That many considered the Roman Catholic Church and her Scriptures important enough to suffer martyrdom can inspire us to study and teach the Scriptures.

Seminarians Corner



Brother Knights,

As I get further along in the program, my classes become much less theoretical and much more practical. I am taking Theology of Marriage this semester, which looks at the sacramental reality that couples enter into when they are married in the Church. This is such an important reality to be aware of especially during this time of upheaval with regard to the true meaning of marriage.

If marriage is just a civil contract, then the Church does not have a leg to stand on in demanding that marriage be allowed only between one man and one woman, but of course we know that marriage is not *just* a civil contract, but it is a sacred covenant entered into with full consent by a man who "leaves his father and mother" and is joined to his wife, "and the two become one flesh."

This is not just a sappy way of saying that marriage brings two people together. These words from the Book of Genesis are divine revelation, and are God's way of telling his Church that marriage is a sacred bond and that it should be taken seriously. Our culture believes that any limitation of "rights" is a limitation of their freedom, but I would argue that our freedom is taken away when we do not allow God's will to be done in our society. If we continually decide that institutions need to be redefined anytime a group feels disenfranchised, then those institutions will eventually be left with no meaning at all.

Marriage has an inherent dignity that is taken away when it is improperly applied, but our society struggles to understand this because the dignity of a sacrament is *unseen*, and we like to say that *seeing is believing*. The sacraments teach us something else, however, we know that a sacrament is a visible sign of an *invisible reality*, so let us pray that the sacrament of marriage will continue to be defended in the Church, and let us be witnesses to the power of the sacrament through our prayer, and through the example of holy, married couples in Council 802.
