



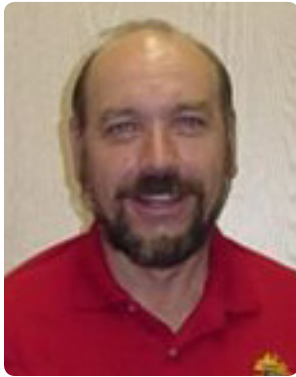

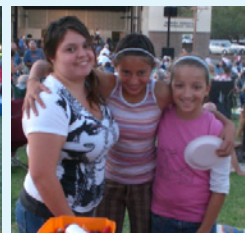

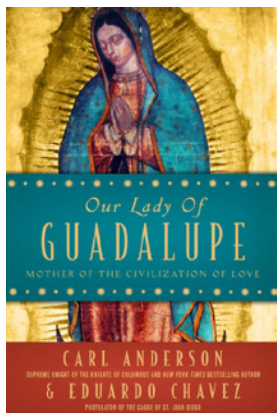

Reader's **Review** by *Dave Conca*

Our Lady of Guadalupe – Mother of the Civilization of Love

by Carl Anderson & Eduardo Chavez

Another one by Supreme Knight Carl Anderson! He writes this book with the help of Msgr. Eduardo Chavez, one of the most of renowned experts on the Guadalupe apparitions and St. Juan Diego's cause for sainthood.



This one is a beautiful story of the Virgin Mary and her appearance to Juan Diego. Carl Anderson relates this visitation in his own words and then describes the importance of Mary in the development of Christianity in Mexico. He also details how this event was the key to spreading Christianity throughout the Americas.

The authors explore the changing face of the Catholic Church in North, Central and South America, and they show how Our Lady of Guadalupe's message was not only historically significant, but also how it speaks to issues confronting the American continents and people today.

At the end of this book, there is a translation of the true Indian account of this appearance by Antonio Valeriano. This account reflects the popular style of speaking used by the Indians at the time of the apparitions. I particularly enjoyed this version of the story.

Today, Our Lady of Guadalupe continues to inspire the devotion of millions – the Mother of the Civilization of Love!

“Under God”

The Knights of Columbus was the leading proponent of the 1954 addition of the words “under God” to the Pledge of Allegiance. U.S. Knights began including the words “under God” in the Pledge of Allegiance in 1951 after the organization’s board of directors adopted a resolution mandating that the amended pledge be formally recited in each of its 750 Fourth Degree assemblies. A year later, the Supreme Council adopted a resolution that urged Congress and the White House to add the words “under God” to the Pledge. Supreme Knight Luke Hart, who was also president of the National Fraternal Congress, persuaded the other 110 fraternal societies to support the resolution as well.
