

Happenings in Bethesda

On December 10, Bishop Roy Campbell, Jr. of Washington celebrated the noon Mass at St. Jane de Chantal Church in Bethesda, and focused his homily on standing up for life. Immediately following the Mass, he led 137 people in a procession up Old Georgetown Road to abortionist LeRoy Carhart's clinic at Wildwood Medical and Shopping Center. During the march, the bishop, Fr. Samuel Giese (pastor of St. Jane's), Fr. Bill Byrne (pastor of Our Lady of Mercy in Potomac), and Fr. Keith Burney (parochial vicar at St. Jane's) led the praying of the rosary. It is reported that seeing the procession, one scheduled patient decided against abortion. A regular presence of pro-life folks is being to develop near the clinic. Each Monday morning, about two dozen people gather from 9-11 AM to pray for the children who are being killed in the womb. On Tuesdays, several prayers are usually there in late mornings and again from 1:00 – 5:30 pm; a candlelight vigil is held most Tuesdays around 6:30 pm. 40 Days for Life

The next 40 Days for Life campaign runs from February 14 through March 25 (Valentine's Day through Feast of the Annunciation). Since these prayer campaigns began in 2007, 13,998 children have been given life, 90 abortion facilities have closed and 170 abortion workers have quit their jobs. Maryland General Assembly Opens January 10

The Maryland Catholic Conference (the legislative arm of the Archdiocese of Baltimore, the Archdiocese of Washington, and the Diocese of Wilmington) is preparing to address a number of major issues that are expected to arise in the 438th legislative session of the Maryland General Assembly, which will begin on Wednesday, January 10. Among the issues is the defeat of legislation to legalize physician-assisted suicide, which has been defeated in each of the last three legislative sessions.
