LeRoy Carhart

On December 21, an ambulance was dispatched to LeRoy Carhart's Nebraska abortion facility for a 24-year old woman who was suffering a possibly dangerous vaginal hemorrhage after an abortion. This is the second known medical emergency this year at Carhart's Bellevue Health Center abortion facility, which also operates under the name Abortion and Contraceptive Clinic of Nebraska. It is affiliated with Carhart's facility in Bethesda, where he conducts abortions throughout all nine months of pregnancy. Since the

beginning of 2013, Carhart has had 12 medical emergencies at his previous clinic in Germantown, 5 in Bellevue, Nebraska, and 1 in Bethesda. At least two of the women – possibly more – have died as a result of their abortions.
