



Len's first parish was Saint Liborius on N. 18th Street in St. Louis. Others were Our Lady of Good Counsel and Saint Casimir. Len and Joyce are charter members of Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton parish.

Len joined the Knights in the late 1990's, and went on to hold several offices, most notably Deputy Grand Knight and Grand Knight. Len is also a member of the 4th Degree, serving as an officer and as a member of the Honor Guard. Joyce has been active in the SEAS Ladies Auxiliary.


