CHAPTER MEETING AT CHRISTOPHER HALL

The August 17 Chapter meeting at St. Mark's Christopher Hall, covered many interesting topics and was very well attended as pictured below with SK Pedro Webber providing a presentation on the unique advantages of life insurance with the Knights of Columbus.



Our PGK Sam Szalwinski, the *State Wheelchair Chairman*, gave a presentation at the Chapter meeting regarding this year's progress towards obtaining the much needed funds for the wheelchair project. He urged all of the Councils in our archdiocese to increase their efforts for the project.

As PGK Sam Szalwinski presented this year's objective for the *wheelchair project*, GK Javier Martinez of the St. Gerard's K of C Council made a donation of \$800 to the project (see below). This donation increased our Archdiocese total funding for the project to \$2,500. In comparison to the \$8,000 funding thus far obtained by the State K of C, our Archdiocese is so far doing quite well. However, much more effort is required for our Archdiocese to obtain at least \$30,000 needed for a goal of obtaining 200 wheelchairs at \$150 per wheelchair.

Our St Marks Knights of Columbus are sponsoring a Blood Drive on Sunday, September 11, in Christopher Hall from 8:30 am to 1:30 pm. This *GIFT OF LIFE* is not only in support of our community, but especially for particular ones of our St Mark's parish. The need for blood is constant and your support is requested for providing this *GIFT OF LIFE* to those of such need.

Family and friends who are in good health are all encouraged to participate in this blood drive. With a <u>parental consent form</u>, anyone 16 years of age that weighs at least 120 pounds are considered as a good candidate. Anyone 17 years of age that weighs at least 110 pounds are also good candidates. <u>There is no upper age limit</u>.

There is no cost to donate blood at the blood drive station and it only takes about one-hour of your time to provide this *GIFT OF LIFE*. In fact, doctors say that it is actually good for your own health to donate blood.

To change your category from a "potential blood donor' to an "approved blood donor", you must present your photo identification, last four digits of your social security number, and your birth date.

While waiting, you and your friends will be provided packaged snacks, fresh fruit and fruit drinks, cookies, donuts, decaffeinated coffee, and water.
