Thanks to Wendell Vice, we now have found a local company, R&R Buttons, that will provide our KofC "dress shirts". These polo shirts are a 35/65% blend of cotton and polyester. They come with our embroidered KofC emblem, Council Name, number and your first name. Wendell is wearing Royal Blue. 
