

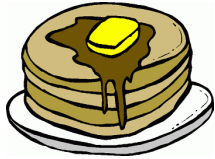
Thanks to all for your support for the Pennies from Heaven program. When I went through the historical financial documents and added up the rebate payouts from the program, I was pleasantly surprised to learn that, over the last 22 years, over \$293K has been given to St. Vincent for the Building Fund! When you add Tuition Credits and other causes, it exceeds a half of a million dollars!

That is because of work put in by so many of you over the years.

As I start to try to grow the program, I think it will be important to maintain a presence at the PFH table after the weekend masses. Skip Kaiser has offered to see if he can have the Ministry Pro application, which tracks the volunteers for each mass, send out an email reminder to the PFH volunteer for each. This information is also printed in the parish bulletin. I will try to send an email as well, until we can be sure that we have coverage every week for the Saturday night / Sunday morning masses. If you get an email saying you are signed up for a mass, and cannot help, please try to get a sub, or at least let me know and maybe I can cover that mass.

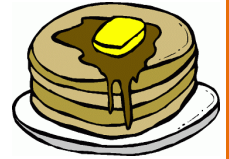

## *Raising Awareness About Life Insurance*

Each September since 2003 has been designated as Life Insurance Awareness Month. Like most awareness-raising campaigns, Life Insurance Awareness Month was created because there is an overwhelming lack of understanding of life insurance, its uses, its benefits, and its variations among the general public. Each year, the Life Insurance Market Research Association (LIMRA) puts out the results from a recent survey, and unfortunately, the numbers they report continue to be discouraging.

A recent survey found that more than 75 percent of people polled did not have a personal financial advisor, even though 68 percent of them said their opinion of the current economic conditions was somewhat unfavorable or very unfavorable.

In other words, a majority of those surveyed were uncomfortable with the economy and the uncertainty it brings, yet they did not seek professional assistance. Maybe they spoke with their friends and family. Maybe they hoped the instability would go away on its own. Maybe they did not know to whom to turn.

If you fall into this category, please remember that as a member of the Knights of Columbus, you have a full-time, professional agent you can call your own. My primary responsibility is the care and service of your family's life insurance, retirement and long-term care needs. I'll answer your questions because I want your decisions to be informed ones. I want to help.

Another LIMRA statistic said 43 percent of people did not buy life insurance because they worry about "making the wrong decision." Talk with me, your agent, and, afterwards, you'll understand that the only wrong decision was not purchasing sooner to protect your family's future.

**After using the direct link or entering the code, follow these instructions:**

**If you are a first time volunteer**, select "Click here to register"

- **You will be asked to complete your personal profile information.** Be sure to note your place of worship (if applicable) so it is easy to track hours. Read and acknowledge the waiver – this is important for safety reasons.
- **NOTE:** When you first register, you will be asked to create a profile but you will not be asked to create a password. The system will send you an email with a temporary password. You can sign-up the first time without creating a password, but the second time you try to log in you will need to either have your temporary password or you will have to click "Don't know password" on the login page.

**If you are a returning volunteer**, select the green "sign up" button next to the date(s) you would like to volunteer.

- The system will prompt you to enter your email and first name, and then prompt you to enter in your password.
- Once logged in, the system may ask you to verify your information. Be sure to note your place of worship (if applicable) so it is easy to track

**Once logged in**, select the date(s) you would like to volunteer by clicking the gray box on the left of the date. When selected, a black check-box will appear.

- Scroll to the bottom of the page and click "register". There will be a green box indicating you have successfully registered for a specific date or dates.
