#### Thought for September

There are some people who aren't too familiar with the rosary and they might wonder why we say it, why we think it is so valuable. The main idea, the heart of the rosary is the mysteries. There are 4 groups of mysteries. When we pray the rosary the most important part is the mysteries. The Hail Mary's are really just background music. Praying the Rosary is actually thinking about the mysteries that come from the Gospels and the traditions of the Church. This can strengthen our faith and bring us closer to Jesus

To think about the mysteries you must know something about them. Unless you read the Bible or know Tradition concerning the mysteries you won't have much to think about and the rosary might become a tedious repetition. To help you, there are also many books written about the mysteries .

For instance the first joyful mystery is the Annunciation where the angel comes to Mary and asks her to be the mother of the Messiah. If this is all you know then there is not a lot to think about. However, if you read up on it you'll find, for instance, that for an unmarried woman to become pregnant was a serious offence against Jewish law. Mary could have been stoned to death. It took a lot of trust in God and courage for her to say yes. Remember Mary was not married to Joseph at this time; she was only engaged (betrothed)

Or take the 1<sup>st</sup> sorrowful mystery, the Agony in the Garden. Jesus, being God, was able to see all time at a glance. He saw how many "Catholics" would ignore Him in the Eucharist and the Blessed Sacrament even after all the suffering he was facing. Many say the indifference of those many "Catholics" He loved and for whom He was suffering caused Him more sorrow than the Cross itself.

The Rosary is a powerful prayer but for it to be effective you must know the mysteries connected with. When you really get to know and appreciate the Rosary you will become a stronger Catholic and a better Knight.
