Grand Knight's Letter

Brothers,

The short respite that we had at the start of the Columbian year is over. Our first meeting of the month falls directly after Labor Day on September 6. I hope that you all have a safe and happy holiday, and that you make it back down to Clifton in time to attend the meeting. This meeting is an important one, as it is the only Council meeting that we will have before the Parish Picnic (covered below in the Deputy Grand Knight's letter) and the Past Grand Knight's Dinner.

The Past Grand Knight's Dinner was moved to September 16 from September 17 to ensure an opening at the International Country Club. We sent out an e-mail to the membership as soon as it was determined. If you did not receive an e-mail, please contact me at james.auwaerter@gmail.com and I'll make sure that your e-mail address is properly spelled in our distribution list. An e-mail will be coming out shortly with a full invitation.

We will hold a First Degree ceremony during the second meeting of the month on September 20. If you know anyone who has expressed interest in joining the Knights, it's a good time to see if they'll be available on that day. For our part, we should have as many Knights present as possible. The dignity of the ceremony is greatly enhanced when the candidates see many of their future Brother Knights in the audience.

During a recent Mass, we heard one of my favorite Gospel readings, and I wanted to take a little bit to discuss it. In the book of Matthew, we hear of the Canaanite woman whose daughter was tormented by a demon, and how she continued to beg for Jesus' aid even in the face of his initial refusal. We see so many instances of Jesus' compassion throughout Scripture, and to call this woman a dog is a clear term of contempt. Earlier in the same book, Jesus taught that what was holy should not be given to dogs, and he seems perfectly willing to send her away without helping her. So what can this Scripture teach us?

The woman persevered in her faith, acknowledging him as Lord repeatedly. When Jesus rebuked her, saying that what was meant for the children [of Israel] should not be thrown to the dogs, the woman easily could have grown angry that her demand was being rejected in such a demeaning fashion. Instead, she accepts the description and turns it back around. The gift of healing that her daughter needs is a mere scrap of the awesome power that Jesus commands. With this, Jesus acknowledges her great faith and provides her the healing she desired.

Many times, it may seem like our prayers are not being answered or aren't being answered the way we want. We should always remember that God hears our prayers, and that his power is truly great. Nothing is beyond his grasp. We only need let go of our pride and let God answer those prayers in the way He wants, knowing that He desires only what is best for us.

Another, more pressing issue is the Church picnic scheduled for September 18. There isn't a lot of time before then, and we will need a fair amount of help, as the parish office and Father Kelly have asked us to do a lot of the work on the day of the picnic. The basic details are that the picnic will begin after the 12:30 Mass ends, and continue until 4:30 or until all the people have left, whichever comes first. The Knights will be setting up the tables and tarps, manning the (6) grills to handle hamburgers and hot dogs, operating a cotton candy machine, watching the moon bounce that the parish is ordering, and cleaning up after it's over. The picnic is free to parishioners, and the rectory is expecting 800+ people. We have several volunteers, but the more people helping, the lighter the load on each of them. We will need people with pick-up trucks to move the tables and grills (the parish only has one, so we need five Knights who can lend theirs for the afternoon) and cooks at the grills and cotton candy machine. This is an excellent chance for us to show the general parish how much we help out, and that is a powerful recruiting tool. Please consider assisting if you can.
