Only Having Insurance "Through Work" Doesn't Work

Do you know anyone whose life or career has drastically changed during these years of economic downtown? It is very likely that someone in your immediate or extended family of friends is facing financial uncertainty. Maybe there's a possibility that you (or your spouse) could lose your job or change employers.
