

AN ENCOUNTER WITH CHRIST

WHAT IS CHRISTIANS ENCOUNTER CHRIST?

Christians Encounter Christ (CEC) is a lay Catholic movement within the Archdiocese of Omaha. The Christians Encounter Christ Movement believes that Christianity can penetrate all areas of the secular world, living, growing and transferring Christ's values to society. The CEC method is introduced in a highly structured three-day "weekend" experience, beginning on Friday evening and ending on Sunday night. It is a combined effort of laity and clergy toward evangelization of the world, in which we live, by strengthened spirituality, lived and shared in everyday environments.

WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF CHRISTIANS ENCOUNTER CHRIST?

"Go, then, to all peoples everywhere and make them my disciples;" (Matt 28:19) Saint John Paul II asked us to evangelize. A goal of the CEC movement is to promote the transformation of environments through Christian leaders who are willing to live and share their principles of being Christian. Through ongoing spiritual growth, these leaders strive to instill the spirit of Christ in all environments in which they are actively involved.

WHAT HAPPENS ON THE WEEKEND?

On the weekend you will join others in song, prayer and discussion. The discussion is centered on eleven talks given by laity and clergy which help you to know, to love and to serve God. The talks present the theme of God's grace in you, how this grace comes more alive in a Christian community, and how to share this grace with others. There is also daily celebration of Mass. This is not a quiet retreat experience, but a lively, joyous, Spirit-filled opportunity for you to allow Jesus to work in your life, see and experience Him in the lives around you, and learn practices and a method of perseverance to keep Him in your life and bring Him to others through your Christian leadership.

WHAT HAPPENS AFTER THE WEEKEND?

CEC develops in adult Christians an awareness of their power and mission to become leaders in the work of evangelization, and provides support to sustain them as they persevere in their work as Christian leaven in family, civic, social and economic life. This support is provided through their ongoing participation in CEC groups. In a group, 4-5 people meet on a regular basis to reflect, pray and encourage each other in their discipleship. Avanti is a gathering of the larger CEC community. At an Avanti, the community spirit of the weekend is continued through group sharing, witness, shared prayer and fellowship.

WHAT ELSE DO I NEED TO KNOW IN ORDER TO MAKE A WEEKEND?

*The weekends are held in Omaha at the Archdiocesan Retreat and Conference Center (ARCC) two times a year.

*The cost of the weekend is \$80—which includes lodging and meals for an entire weekend.

*2015 dates are on the front of this brochure.

*CEC is a Catholic weekend open to persons of all faiths. The only requirement is that you are a Christian who wishes to strengthen your spiritual life.

*The weekend is open to married, single, divorced and widowed individuals. The format of the weekends is such that if you are married, the husbands are asked to attend the weekend followed by their wives.

HOW DO I SIGN UP?

Anyone who has been on a CEC Weekend can complete your application and serve as your "sponsor". Consider this your personal invitation to contact the person who gave you this brochure, or anyone who has attended a CEC Weekend. They will be more than happy to answer any questions you might have and serve as your sponsor.
