September contains many days on the Liturgical calendar that are of interest to us as a Council. On September 9, we remember St. Peter Claver. On September 18, we can remember St. Joseph of Cupertino, who is the patron of aviators and air travelers. He is of special importance to those involved with NAS Meridian.


While Ember Days are no longer obligatory or commemorated on the Novus Ordo calendar since the reform of the Liturgy following Vatican II, these days can still be observed as days of fasting, abstinence, and prayer. Originally tied to times of harvest, the original three ember-tides occur in June, September, and December. Later a set was added for March. This ember-tide includes Wednesday, September 20, Friday, September 22, and Saturday, September 23. Traditionally these days are a time of thanksgiving for the gifts of God at harvest and a reminder to use those gifts in moderation.

The gifts of God are intended for charity to those in need. Traditionally, Ember days were set aside for ordinations of clergy. Would that we had more ordinations. They will be good days to practice penance & pray for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. Soon after the fall equinox and the lengthening of darkness, we celebrate the feast of St. Michael and the other archangels. We ask for their protection. In a time when spiritual darkness seems to be ever-increasing, we would do well to ask their intercession at all times.



Brother Knights,

My time at St. Richard continues to be life-giving and challenging! I am knee deep in marriage prep, weddings, baptisms, funeral prep, funerals, and more. I am learning fast the vital importance of prayer.

Of course, prayer is stressed at the seminary, and we were warned about a thousand times: "Don't let your prayer slip when you get into the parish! Don't stop praying!" But I now know there are two reasons that this was stressed so much: 1. It is VERY easy to stop praying if you allow yourself to and 2. It is VERY difficult at first to make sure you are spending time in quiet prayer when you have a thousand things coming at you, and once bad habits are formed, we know they are hard to break.

So, the good news, I have not stopped praying. I went on a short retreat in late August.

Deacon James Keating led the retreat, and stressed the importance of not just praying *for* things, but offering our pains, sufferings, and joys to Jesus and allowing the Lord to work on us as ministers. He stressed that ministers of the Gospel must give to their people from their "surplus," not from their "reserve tank." If ministers cannot receive love from God then there is no way they can offer it to others. I may be able to scrape by on my own specific gifts and talents for a while, but that will not last.

So, I offer this advice for all of you as well. In prayer, don't just ask *for* things, but ask the Lord to transform you. Offer to him your deepest desires, your greatest joy and your greatest pain, and He will show you His love for you, and then you can give that to others. If you would like to read a good book by Deacon Keating, search his name on Amazon, he has a bunch of good stuff out on a variety of topics!

On Saturday, September 9, pro-life Americans will honor the memory of the more than 50 million unborn victims of abortion during the National Day of Remembrance for Aborted Children. Solemn prayer services will be held simultaneously at gravesites and memorial sites around the country. Pastor Ryan Sullivan of Grace Community Church will be the main speaker.

The National Day of Remembrance is organized by three national pro-life groups, Citizens for a Pro-Life Society, Priests for Life and the Pro-Life Action League. Locally this event is organized by Pro-Life Mississippi. The location for the event is the same location that once housed a glass building containing 50,000,000 pennies in honor of all the babies who have lost their lives to abortion. Today, there is a plaque in its place that reads "If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land." II Chronicles 7:14.
