Thought for August

All sin has consequences and when someone dies the consequences of their sins remain as does their attachment to some sins ...removing that attachment and those consequences as well as bringing their love of God to its proper level would seem to be part of their perfection. Many theologians have studied this but have no answer. However we can speculate, that is, make some educated guesses since there are some things that are certain. There are only two ways to measure your love for someone. Suffering and sacrifice

Jesus showed His love for us by his sacrifice and suffering, especially in his Passion and crucifixion. And God did ask the dead to show their love for Him while they lived, which some tried to do but many didn't. So in purgatory they will learn to love God as they should have. They can see the consequences of their good actions (for which they will be rewarded in heaven) and see the consequences of their sins. And it's reasonable to speculate that sufficient prayers and masses not only remove their attachment to sin but also the consequences. Seeing the sad consequences of their sins will certainly cause them to suffer.

It helps to think that if they were going to meet the Pope or some other famous person, they would want to appear at their best with clean nice clothes. In Purgatory they can "clean their clothes", so to speak and so feel comfortable when they do meet God.
